

Miniature Lighthouse

Directions:



around

- 1. Cut out strips of white construction paper about an inch wide and wrap them around the upside-down red cup to make stripes. Attach the pieces with glue or tape.
- 2. Cut out black squares of construction paper and attach them to the red cup for windows and a door. You could also use decorative tape, or decorate the cup however you like.
- 3. Turn on the tea light and set it on top of the upturned end of the red cup. You can create a shiny flame out of foil if you don't have a tea light and attach it to the cup.
- 4. Cut out a circle of black construction paper to fit onto the bottom of the clear cup and glue the paper on to the cup.
- 5. Place the clear cup, upside down, over top of the bigger cup, and let your light shine. You can use your lighthouse as a night light and switch it on and off as often you like by removing the clear cup to access the light switch.
