Township unveils floor plan for library, Board approves site plan on municipal campus

The new Shelby Township Library is taking shape as a formal site plan was approved by the township's Board of Trustees June 4, and Library Director Katie Ester unveiled a floor plan for the new 26,000-square-foot library that will sit adjacent to the municipal band shell at 52700 Van Dyke Ave.


The new library features increased space for children's programming, a technology lab, a dedicated teen area, four meeting rooms and five study rooms among other added amenities that are absent for the current library at 51680 Van Dyke Ave.

"The process of planning the new Shelby Township Library has been joyful work," Ester said. "We have an outstanding team of architects, engineers and designers that are working with us to plan a library that meets our needs and is a functional yet beautiful space. Obtaining site plan approval is an exciting step towards our groundbreaking day. Truthfully, every step that gets our Shelby Township residents closer to walking through the doors of their new library is a thrilling one."

The new library will sit on land currently occupied by the Shelby Township Parks, Recreation and Maintenance Department. Parks and Recreation staff will move to the new Shelby Township Activities Center, and the Maintenance staff will move to the old Fire Station No. 4 at 51599 Schoenherr Road.

At it's Nov. 20, 2019 meeting, the Board approved a preliminary budget of \$11.2 million for the new library. The added facility will be paid for with budgeted, saved funds and require no tax increase, no debt, no bonding and no borrowing. Following the site plan approval by the Board of Trustees, the next step in the process will be for the township engineer to post a request for proposals for construction.

"Now that we know where the building will likely sit, and what it will look like, the only step left will be to build it," Stathakis said. "That's a significant step, but we are closer than ever to giving our township it's first-ever standalone library."



Township announces grand opening celebration for Shelby Township Activities Center

With the new 41A District Court open on time and under budget and final touches being put on the new Fire Station No. 4 and a police department expansion, Shelby Township is ready to throw a party.

"Now that the court is open and it came in on time and under budget, we can turn our focus to some really exciting assets that will directly enhance the quality of life in Shelby Township," Township Supervisor Rick Stathakis said. "Renovations are about to start on the activities center, and we're excited to announce a grand opening celebration at that facility Sept. 28."

From noon to 3 pm. Sept. 28, residents will get their first look at the former home of the Boys and Girls Club at 14975 21

Mile Road. The Shelby Township Activities Center will open after a \$795,000 facelift that was approved by the Board of Trustees at its April 16 meeting.

"This new facility will be unlike anything we have ever had in the township," Parks, Recreation and Maintenance Director Joe Youngblood said. "The centerpiece is a 7,500-square-foot full gym with space for multiple basketball courts, pickleball courts, volleyball, a walking track and much more. We also have more meeting space, more space for classes and a beautiful new activity room/cafeteria that will be a big hit with our seniors."

"While this may not be the same style of recreation facility as some municipalities, I believe it is a better one," Stathakis said. "We have stayed true to our directives from the taxpayers and addressed the needs of the current senior center and then some. We have increased the footprint of the senior center from 11,404 square feet at its current location on Van Dyke Ave. to 25,000-square feet for a total price of \$3,750,000 for the property and site improvements.

"More importantly, though, the STAC is a true community space for seniors, families, friends and neighbors to gather and further the bonds of community that separate Shelby Township from similar communities. There are many options in the local private sector for fitness and other recreation activities such as aquatics, but there is no number of treadmills or swimming lanes that could

build a stronger community than the environment we will have at the STAC."

At the grand opening, residents can tour the facility and also enjoy music, bouncers, food trucks, crafts, games and much more.

"It's not often that we get to open a facility like the activities center, so I am really excited to see the celebration that Parks and Recreation puts together," Stathakis said. "Anyone that has been to our art fair or Christmas Aglow knows that the Shelby Township Parks, Recreation and Maintenance Department knows how to have fun, and I'm sure they will pull out all the stops to open this facility with a great day."

Have you checked your smoke detector?

Three out of five fire deaths result from fires on properties without working smoke detectors. Make sure your smoke alarm is working by testing the batteries.

- Check and change batteries in carbon monoxide detectors twice a year
- Test alarms monthly.
- For smoke alarms that use lithium (long-life) batteries, replace the entire smoke alarm
- Make an escape place and practice at least once a year.

MAP OF EVENTS







Permitted Home Improvement

Summer brings out more than just the sun and bugs. The Common projects that require Permits: freedom of warm weather causes a sensation in some to start home improvements and make the most of the few months we have. If you're taking on a project this summer, it's important to do it the right way.

Almost all replacements and additions of mechanical, electrical, plumbing and structural items require a permit from the Shelby Township Building Department. Permits allow an inspector to verify and approve the standard set by the code commission. The inspection is your safeguard verifying that a qualified inspector, concerned with meeting the requirements of health and safety standards, has viewed your project. A permit and inspection also helps to prevent the need for costly repairs caused by poor labor or improperly installed parts.

The minor fee required for a permit safeguards the time you have this summer and future summers from headache and can protect your investment for years to come.

Water Waste

Easy Savings

In 2017, 8.16 billion gallons of water were used in lawn irrigation in Shelby Township. Can you imagine how much that cost? The rain may hinder your outdoor plans, but it can help save you a bundle on your water bill. We've got some hot tips to save you some cool cash:

- Installing an automatic rain shut-off device to your sprinklers will keep them from running after it rains and prevents overwatering.
- Watering every other day decreases your chances of over-watering your grass.
- Set your sprinklers to water at night during non-peak hours between midnight and 5 a.m.
- Rain barrels collect rain water you can use to water plants and gardens.
- · Change your sprinklers to make them more water-efficient. Even replacing heads can cut down on the amount of water wasted. Position your sprinklers appropriately, too. You don't want to pay to water the road.
- Mow your grass on a high setting keeping it at the upper recommended limit of about two inches. This allows the soil to receive the water but is short enough to prevent evaporation.

Don't Get Washed Away

The rain keeps coming this summer and it's unlikely to stop. Portions of Shelby Township are located on a 100-year floodplain that makes certain areas more suspectible to flooding. Find out if your property is in the regulated floodplain by calling the Shelby Township Floodplain Management Office at 586-731-5969 or by visiting the Building Department in township hall. Maps can also be reviewed online at fema.gov or at the Building Department offices.

Most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover damage from floods. Flood insurance is only available to participating communities in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), such as Shelby Township. Be sure to check your policy to ensure you have adequate coverage.

Other ways to cut down on flooding:

- Keep smaller ditches and streams free of debris. This can dramatically improve the run-off capacity of lowlying areas, as well as greatly reduce the occurrence blockage that contributes to flooding.
- Don't pour oil, grease, pesticides, or other pollutants down storm drains or into the ditches and streams. Our streams and wetlands help moderate flooding and are habitat for fish, frogs, and other species that provide us with recreation or food.
- Clear your gutters twice a year.
- Turn rain spouts to drain away from your and your neighbor's houses.

The Shelby Township Beautification Committee oversees the annual Shelby Township Beautification Awards. These awards are presented to Shelby Township homeowners for extensive floral and landscape achievement at their residences. Community members make nominations, and finalists are judged by the STBC. Homeowners can win a Beautification Award up to three times. Following the third Beautification Award, an honoree's name is placed on the Hall of Fame plaque located in Shelby Township Hall.

Code Green

Forgetting something? It's easy to do after a long winter. Here are some summer codes to brush up on.

Trash - Placed at the curb 5:30 PM or later the day before pick up. Containers should be removed from curbside by 8 PM the day of pick up. For large items remember to call ahead of time for a special pick up.

Sidewalk - Keep the sidewalks clear from obstructions. All low hanging branches, shrubs or bushes that protrude into and over the sidewalk need to be trimmed back behind the edge of the sidewalk and high enough for a bicyclist to pass under.

Yard - Keep the grass cut at a height of no greater than six (6) inches. On vacant property, grass cannot exceed 10 inches. Owner may be subject to a citation and fine if not kept up to code.

Sales - No permit is required for garage, yard, estate or similiar type sales. Limit is two (2) per year (12 month period). Sale cannot exceed 4 days.

Signs - Sale or political signs shall not encroach into any road right-of-way nor shall they be attached to any utility poles or trees. No political sign shall be erected more than 45 days prior to an election and shall be removed not more than three days following an election. Approval of the property owner shall be required prior to the placement of a political sign on any site.

Firewood - Shelby Township ordinance requires that firewood be neatly stacked. While not required, it is recommended that the firewood be raised off the ground so as to prevent animals from nesting under it.

Fireworks - Use of fireworks for celebration is allowed, however civil infractions will be given out for disrupting the public peace, violating township nuisance ordinance or creating and depositing litter. Violations can result in a \$1,000 fine. New fireworks ordinance laws limit the use of fireworks to the following days:

- 11 a.m. Dec. 31 through 1 a.m. Jan. 1
- 11 a.m.-11:45 p.m. on the Saturday and Sunday immediately preceeding Memorial Day
- 11 a.m.-11:45 p.m. on June 29, June 30 and July 1-4
- 11 a. m.-11:45 a.m. on July 5 if that date is on Friday or Saturday
- 11 a.m.-11:45 p.m. on the Saturday immediately preceeding Labor Day.
