

Wine glass painting

SUPPLIES:

- Wine glass
- paint
- brushes

In your kit you received a wine glass, a strip of paints, and some brushes. The paints are Folk Art Enamel Paints for glassware. Do not paint inside the glass or high enough up where a mouth would touch the paint. Hand wash your glassware.

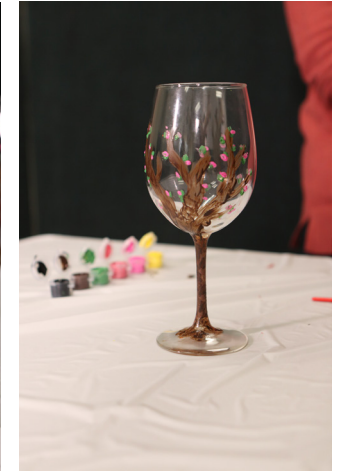

DIRECTIONS:

TREE



1. For the trunk you can mix colors and then dab the paint on to get a better texture on your tree trunk, or just do all one color. It may take a couple of coats to get the feel you want.
2. Once your trunk is done, using that same color you can start the branches of your tree. Branches get narrower as they go up.
3. Let your trunk and branches dry.
4. Next add the leaves and flowers. Dab a little green wherever you imagine new leaves on the branches. Then wash and dry your brush and then dab flowers among the leaves.
5. If your paints are more suited to autumn look you can dab fall leaf colors on your branches. Even put a few on the base of the glass to show the fallen leaves.



TULIP



1. Your tulip wine glass will can have a little surprise when someone drinks from the glass. Start with a light color like yellow and put a bunch of dots around the place where the bowl of the glass meets the stem. Remember, only paint the outside of the glass. Let it dry.
2. Then take a little black or brown and cover those dots making an even ring around the bowl of the glass, just about 1/2 of the base.
3. When the black dries, take some green and paint the stem of the glass. This can go up over the black a little like a tulip leaf around a flower.
4. Next, take your tulip color and your widest brush. Going around the glass, make the flower petals. This will take a couple of coats of paint.
5. Mix the flower color with a darker color to add definition to your flower petals.
