Sec. 30-138. - Subdivision and project improvements.

(c) *Utility improvement standards.*

(6) *Trees.*

- a. Existing trees near street rights-of-way shall be preserved by the subdivider.
- b. Street trees shall be provided as follows: at least one per lot or not less than one tree for each 50 feet, placed halfway between the sidewalk and curb.
- c. The following species of trees shall be permitted:
 1. Norway maple.
 2. London plane.
 3. Pin oak.
 4. Honey locust.
 5. Cork tree.
 6. Sugar maple.
 7. Little leaf linden.
 8. Modesta ash.
 9. Idaho locust.
 10. Moraine locust.
 11. Hop horn beam.
 12. Paul scarlet hawthorne.
 13. Such other species as may be approved by the superintendent of the department of public works.

Sec. 74-57. - Required trees.

(c) *Specifications.*

- (1) *Height and diameter.* All replacement trees shall be at least eight feet tall and have a 1½-inch A.E.G. or greater, and shall be inspected and approved by a building official on-site upon planting.
- (2) *Spacing.* Such trees shall be planted with minimum tree spacing of 20 feet apart and in accordance with standardized forestry and horticultural practices as established by the American Association of Nurserymen or the National Arborist Association.
- (3) *Planting.* Each such tree shall be staked, fertilized, mulched and watered.
- (4) *Guarantee.* All replacement trees shall be guaranteed for one year.
