The Parks, Recreation and Maintenance Department looks after our vast array of facilities and plans various programs. Our parks provide an escape from the day-to-day hustle. Home to more than 100 species of native birds and animals, including nesting American bald eagles, and more than 80 species of trees, shrubs and wildflowers, it's hard not to fall for the beauty and serenity of Shelby Township.

Located just east of our municipal offices is Cherry Creek Golf Club, one of the finest public golf and banquet destinations in Michigan and hosts many of our special events. Shelby Township is home to 4,000-acre Stony Creek Metropark, 500-acre Stony Creek Lake and the Macomb Orchard Trail that connects to 180 miles of trails across southeast Michigan.

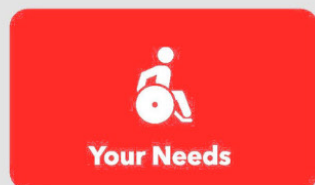

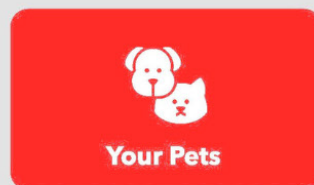

Beyond physical materials, delve into digital resources like **e-books**, **audiobooks**, **online courses** and **databases**, all accessible from home. The library's sense of community shines through **author talks**, **book clubs** and **workshops**, fostering connections and personal growth. Obtaining a library card isn't just about resources; it's joining a community that values learning. As a member of the Suburban Library Cooperative, your card is also valid across Macomb County, Troy and Harper Woods. Unite with a community that values learning through engaging events and workshops. Borrowing Items

For most items there is no borrowing limit. Take as many books and DVDs as you can carry.

Most items may be borrowed for 21 days.

- Books
- Compact Discs
- Audiobooks
- Magazines

Late fines for these items are \$0.15/per day overdue.

New Adult Fiction can be borrowed for 14 days.

Late fines for these items are \$0.15/per day overdue.

DVDs can be borrowed for seven days.

Late fines for these items are \$1.50/per day overdue.

Renewals

Most items will automatically renew two days prior to their due date. If an item does not renew, it usually indicates another patron is in line for it. To confirm whether your item has been renewed, log in to your library account. Items from other libraries are subject to the policies of their respective home library.

Library Services

Fax

The library has a fax machine and domestic faxes are \$1 per page to send. The library does not receive faxes or send international faxes. We are unable to do international faxing.

Printing

Black-and-white prints run \$0.10 per page, and color prints are \$0.25.

WiFi Access

The library provides wireless internet access anywhere in the building.

Pick My Books

Share your reading preferences with us and we'll curate three selections we believe you'll relish. The greater the information you provide, the more adeptly we can identify your ideal match. Once your choices are prepared for pick-up at the library, we'll inform you. The form is accessible on the library's website.

Promotions and Discounts

Your library card entitles you to discounts through the Go Library Card Program. Obtain a Michigan Activity Pass for access to local cultural destinations and natural attractions. Utilize your library card to secure a \$5 reduction on your online ticket booking for a visit to the Detroit Zoo.

Programs

Check the events calendar at shelbytwp.org/library. Youth programs include storytimes and activities. Teens have various teen meet-ups. Adults can join a book club or afternoon and evening programs.

Study Rooms

The library provides five study rooms on a first-come, first-served basis. Rooms accommodate up to six people with glass boards and markers. Inquire about a study room at the Information Desk. If no study rooms are vacant, ample tables, chairs and outlets are available for use.



Check out one of our **Story Boxes**. Each box comes with everything you need for your storytime. We also have **STEM Explorer Kits** and **Book Club Kits** for adults.

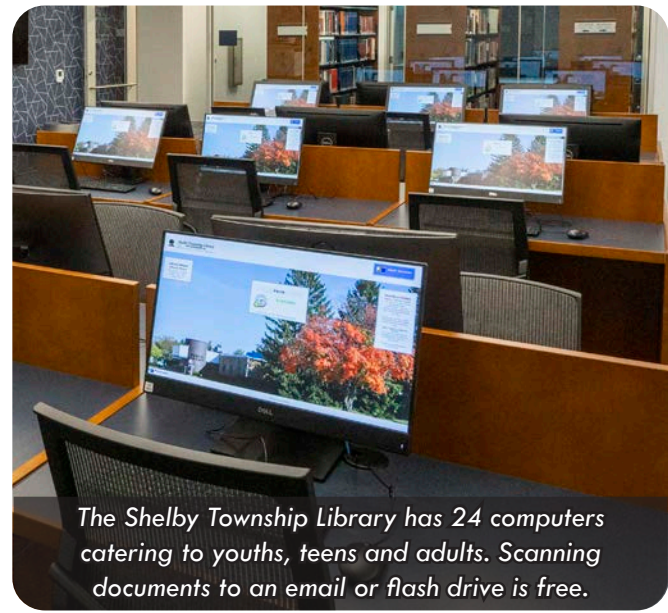

Wireless Hotspots

Hotspots are accessible to Shelby Township residents 18 and older in good standing with a valid ID and a Shelby Township Library Card. **Returns must be made to our Welcome Desk inside the library.** The borrowing period is 14 days, and a late fine of \$1.50 per day applies.

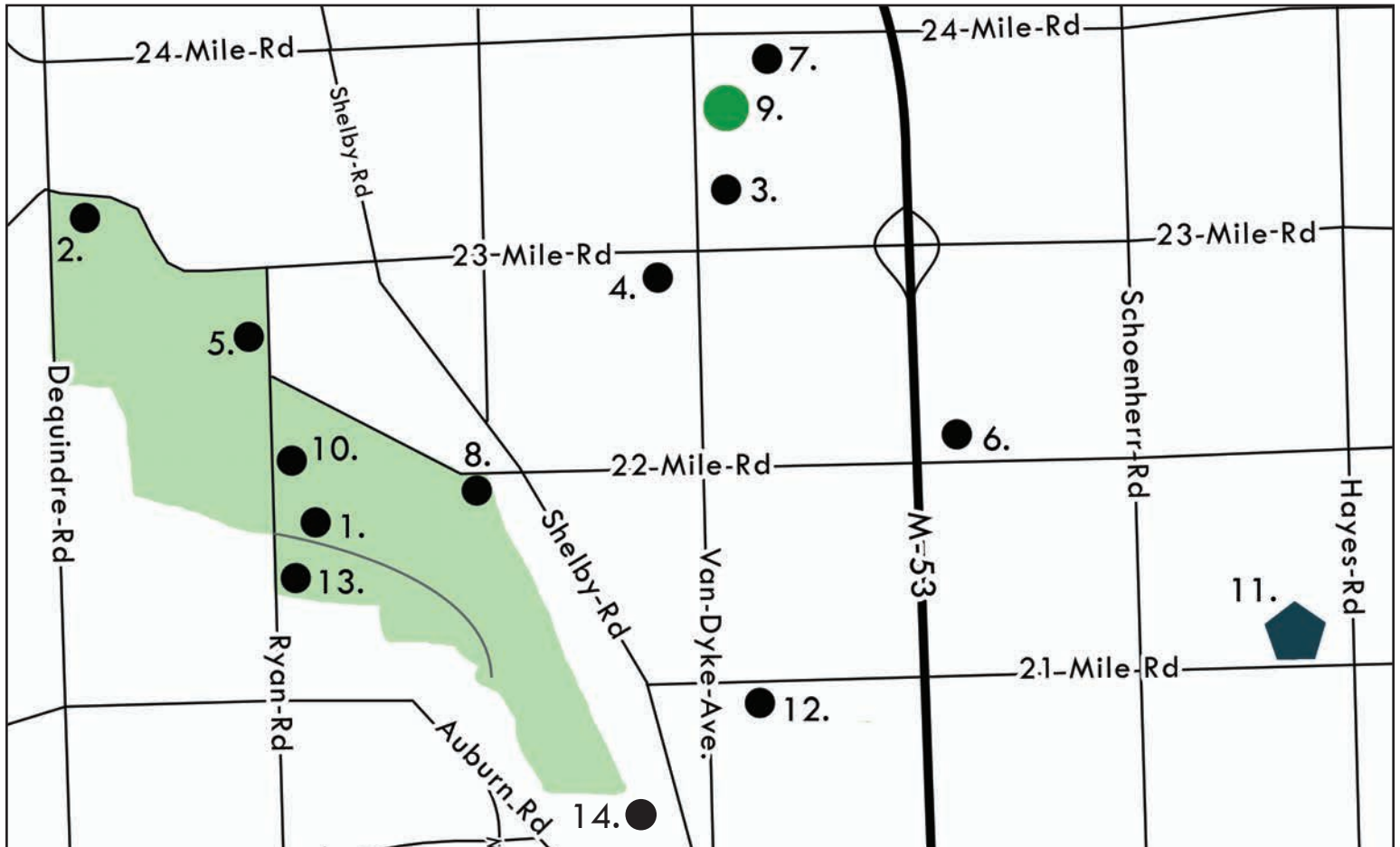

VOTER INFORMATION

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN MICHIGAN?

In order to vote in Michigan you must be:

- a U.S. citizen
- at least 18 years old by Election Day
- a Michigan resident
- a resident of the city or township in which you are applying to register to vote for at least 30 days

WHERE CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE?

You may register at any of the following locations:

- the township or county clerk's office
- any Michigan Secretary of State branch office
- at michigan.gov/vote

MUST I RE-REGISTER FROM TIME TO TIME?

Registration in Michigan is kept current by maintaining your correct personal information and by voting. Your driver's license or state-issued ID must match your voter registration information. Business addresses or post office boxes are not acceptable. Contact the Clerk's Office or visit michigan.gov/vote to see if you are registered to vote.

WHEN DO I HAVE TO CHANGE MY REGISTRATION?

If you move within Shelby Township, you may:

- change your address at any Michigan Secretary of State branch office, an ExpressSOS kiosk or at michigan.gov/vote
- submit a change of address/re-registration to the Clerk's Office
- return your original voter ID card indicating the change of address

After your address is updated, you will receive a new voter ID card indicating your polling location and districts.

Name changes must be made at a Michigan Secretary of State branch office. If you move from one municipality to another, you must re-register in your new municipality.

WHERE DO I VOTE?

Each voter must vote in the polling place designated to serve the precinct in which they reside. This location is on your voter ID card. If you prefer to vote by absentee ballot contact the Clerk's Office.

WHEN ARE THE POLLS OPEN ON ELECTION DAY?

Polls open at 7 a.m. and remain open until 8 p.m. Anyone in line at 8 p.m. will be allowed to vote

DO I VOTE AT THE SAME PLACE EACH TIME?

Yes, your precinct location is on your voter ID card. The Clerk's Office will notify you in writing if the location changes.

DO I NEED TO SHOW A VOTER ID CARD TO VOTE?

No, voter ID cards list districts and polling locations. Voters should bring a photo ID on Election Day. Registered voters not in possession of a photo ID must sign an affidavit stating they are not in possession of an ID at that time. Contact the Clerk's Office with any questions.

I HAVE A PHYSICAL HANDICAP, MAY I VOTE AT THE POLLS?

All polling places are ADA compliant and equipped with voter assist terminals. These terminals provide voters with ballot language using audio output, large print or high contrast readouts. Voters can make selections via touch screen, keypad or sip-puff technology. Ballots indicating the voter's selections are printed and inserted into the precinct tabulator by the voter.

A voter may receive assistance from another person provided the assisting person is not the voter's employer, agent of the employer or agent of a union to which the voter belongs. Voters may also request assistance from the precinct Board of Election Inspectors.

HOW DO I OBTAIN AN ABSENTEE BALLOT?

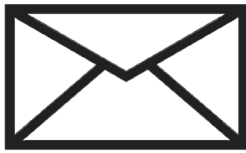
Applications must be made in writing to the Clerk's Office. Applications are available at the Clerk's Office approximately six weeks before every election or at michigan.gov/vote.

The Clerk's Office maintains a mailing list of voters who receive applications each election cycle. If you would like to be added to this "permanent AV list," contact the Clerk's Office.

HOW DO I VOTE ABSENTEE?

Registered voters may request an absentee ballot by submitting a completed application to the Clerk's Office via mail, fax, email or in-person drop-off. The Clerk's Office will mail a ballot to applicants promptly. Voted ballots sealed in AV return envelopes with the voter's signature in the required section must be received by the Clerk's Office no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day.

Shelby Township Clerk Stanley Grot mailed more than 55,000 ABSENTEE BALLOTS during the 2020 election cycles.



Township Clerk Stanley T. Grot improved election accessibility in 2020 with a drive-thru voting event. Staff served more than 150 voters outside of Township Hall.

“No Knock” Ordinance Information

Dear Shelby Township Home Owner:

Effective Oct. 6, 2005, Shelby Township's "No Knock" ordinance permits township residents to add their names to a non-solicitation list. This action restricts certain hawkers, vendors, peddlers and solicitors from door-to-door sales at our residents' homes. The list is provided to any Michigan-based door-to-door salespeople when applying to the township for a license to solicit.

We provide door stickers as a reminder to solicitors that you prefer them not to knock. The township attorneys, Kirk, Huth, Lange & Badalamenti, generously donated stickers that are available at the Clerk's Office.

Please remember that not all solicitors are subject to this ordinance. Examples of those exempted include out-of-state vendors, scout troops, religious groups, and some charitable and political groups protected by the U.S. Constitution. However, when they contact the Clerk's Office to advise us of their intended activities, we provide them with a copy of the non-solicitation list. It will then be up to the groups whether or not they wish to visit those addresses where they may not be well received.

If your address is on our non-solicitation list, and someone who is not an out-of-state vendor or advancing a religious, charitable or political cause visits your home, you may call the Shelby Township Police Department to report the incident. An available officer will investigate, advise, and, if necessary, issue a ticket. Please remember that this is not a life-or-death situation, so please be patient if an officer cannot immediately respond.

Should you decide to remove your name from the list, you must contact the Clerk's Office, in writing.

To include your address on this list, please call the Clerk's Office at 586-731-5102, 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m., Monday through Friday to leave your name, address and telephone number. You may also stop at the Clerk's Office in the upper level of Township Hall during regular business hours. We will be happy to take your information at that time.

Automatic Bill Payment Information Sheet

What is Automatic Bill Payment?

Instead of writing checks, mailing payments or paying bills in person, customers can authorize the Shelby Township DPW to withdraw payments electronically from their checking or savings account.

How does the customer enroll in the Automatic Bill Payment program?

Customers complete the Automatic Bill Payment Enrollment Form and include a \$2 check payable to the Shelby Township DPW along with their financial institution routing number.

How long does it take to get on the plan?

Customers may sign up for the plan at any time, and depending on the timing of the customer's quarterly bill, most will be converted to Automatic Bill Payment within 30-60 days. Water bills should continue to be paid as they normally would until they are notified on the water billing statement of the automatic payment date.

How will the customer know the amount of their bill?

Customers will be sent quarterly statements at least 20 days before the payments will be deducted from their accounts. Water bill amounts will fluctuate quarterly, and Shelby Township customers should take this into consideration when signing up for Automatic Bill Payment.

How does the customer know that the bill has been paid?

Each bill paid by Automatic Bill Payment will be clearly itemized on their financial institution account statement. The next quarterly billing statement sent by the the Shelby Township DPW will show a zero past due balance.

Is there a charge for Automatic Bill Payment?

Yes. The Shelby Twp DPW will charge each account a \$2 enrollment fee plus a 35-cent per transaction fee. Most financial institutions don't charge for this service. If a customer isn't sure, they should check with their financial institution.

Can the customer withdraw from the program?

Yes. The customer should write to the the Shelby Township DPW to cancel enrollment.

Can the customer be canceled from the program by the Shelby Township DPW?

Yes. The customer may be canceled immediately upon receipt of the second Automatic Bill Payment returned for insufficient funds.

Can Final Reads be paid through Automatic Bill Payment?

No. Final Reads must be paid by check or cash. A request for a Final Read will automatically cancel a customer from Automatic Bill Payment.
