MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY BOARD OF TRUSTEES HELD ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 25, 2011 IN THE LOBBY CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 52700 VAN DYKE, SHELBY TOWNSHIP, MICHIGAN.

The work session was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Supervisor Richard Stathakis.

# 1. Interviews with Candidates for General Employee's Civil Service Commission

Mrs. Lisa Suida, HR Director, stated that the Board will be interviewing candidates for a 6-year appointment to the General Employees' Civil Service Commission. This will be a Board appointed Township representative. There are three applicants present this afternoon who are very interested in this position. She has worked with two of the three candidates in the past.

Mr. Stathakis advised that Mrs. Suida compiled a list of questions that can be asked of the candidates. The questions include –

- Do you have previous experience with the Civil Service process
- Why are you interested in this commission appointment
- What is your experience with job description development, identifying required knowledge skills and abilities for a position
- What is your experience with compensation programs and identifying appropriate pay grades for a job
- Please provide an example of a time when you had to make a decision to resolve a conflict between two parties and how did you make your determination
- What is the most important character trait or experience that you bring to this role

Mr. Stathakis stated the Board can ask any questions they choose but he believes this is a good format to start.

The process began with the following candidates being interviewed –

Mr. Stathakis advised a decision will be made at the February 1, 2011 regular Board of Trustees meeting.

### 2. Update on Water Reservoir with Township Engineer

Mrs. Carol Thurber and Mrs. Tina Vaglica representing Fazal Khan & Associates were in attendance.

Mrs. Thurber submitted information to the Board for their review followed by a slide presentation regarding the possibility of constructing and maintaining a water reservoir for Shelby Township.

Mrs. Thurber advised that preliminary engineering was done to determine the benefits of water storage for Shelby Township. A study was done to determine

the cost effectiveness of water storage and to explore other peak hour reduction methods.

They did a WaterCAD Hydraulic Model of the entire system which was performed as part of the water liability study. They completed an analysis of current ordinance text that may be implemented and a cost analysis for rate of return for a storage tank and ordinance modifications. Water storage helps to even out The tank storage locations were determined by selecting areas that were indicated in the water model as those that experienced the greatest pressure drop on maximum usage days. The Township-owned properties were considered in order to eliminate land acquisition or easement costs. scenarios were considered consisting of three different methods - one was a 2 million gallon tank placed in five different areas, placing two 2 million gallon tanks in two locations and placing three 1 million gallon tanks at various locations. map was displayed showing the tank locations. The WaterCAD Hydraulic Model was run using 2017 demands in order to consider future growth of the Township.

With the different analyses that were run, there were two that provided optimum peak reduction. One was at River Bends Park with a cost estimate of \$5.3 million. That included some capital improvements that needed to be made. The improvements were recommended as part of the water reliability study.

Several aerial graphs were presented showing a sample steel storage tank, proposed location of a tank at River Bends Park and the Township Campus site with graphs depicting the peak hours at both locations. Mrs. Thurber pointed out that the graphs are to scale showing the size of the tanks in comparison to the surrounding area.

Mrs. Thurber stated that as a result of the hydraulic analysis the site at River Bends Park provided a 34% reduction from the contract peak with the site at the Township Municipal Campus providing a 28% reduction from the contract peak.

In addition to the hydraulic analysis, there was a review of the Water System Ordinance (Article IV of Chapter 58).

According to the current ordinance, there is a voluntary watering restriction with no watering between 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on even/odd days.

The DWSD will offer a rate reduction if the ordinance is changed from voluntary to mandatory.

Other communities have implemented a mandatory watering restriction ordinance with a \$500 fine for non-compliance.

The current peak hour without storage is 39.12 MGD in comparison to a DWSD peak hour per contract of 50 MGD.

Mrs. Thurber stated the cost analysis of a 2 million gallon tank is estimated at \$5.3 million plus operation and maintenance costs of about \$80,000 per year.

Based on 5.5% interest and a 20-year investment, the yearly cost for construction of a single 2 million gallon tank is \$443,610. The yearly cost for operation and maintenance is \$80,000. Therefore, the total yearly cost (over 20 years) is \$523,610.

A rate comparison study was presented with information based on contract negotiations with DWSD in March, 2010.

A conservative estimate of 70% of the total estimate rate reduction based on DWSD figures is \$1,082,900. After removing the annual costs of construction,

operations and maintenance, the annual cost provides an anticipated net savings of \$559,290. Thus the pay back period is calculated to be 9.47 years.

Security of the site was discussed. Fence and closed circuit televisions or cameras would have to be installed, and a multitude of alarms would have to be put in place.

Mrs. Thurber said there is a recognized savings from going from voluntary to mandatory watering of approximately \$163,800 per year. This will result in no upfront costs to the Township besides amending the ordinance. This is their first recommendation.

Storage does help and reduces peaks. It was suggested that for the next three years, the Township should observe other communities that have recently constructed storage tanks to compare actual paybacks with the theoretical paybacks expected. These communities include Grosse Pointe Woods, Harrison Township, Orion Township, the Village of New Haven, and Rochester Hills. She would like the Board to follow what they are doing.

Mrs. Thurber stated with the mandatory watering restrictions the public has to be educated and enforcement needs to be in place.

Mr. Flynn doesn't see any reason to tell our residents how much water they can use. There is plenty of water. He was told it is a cost factor. Mr. Flynn said this is a free market – he isn't going to tell anyone when they can't turn their faucet on.

Mrs. Manzella asked how the voluntary restriction is implemented. Mr. Schoenherr said the goal is to bring the peaks down. The peaks have been affected to a minimal – not what they would like to see. With the voluntary restriction in place, there is no cost to the Township. With the mandatory restriction, the citizens need to be educated. He hopes good citizens will want to follow along with this plan. If not, there will have to be some consequences. There will be no infrastructure improvements. If we can gain some ground on these peaks with a mandatory ordinance, then when we go to renegotiate the contract, we will be able to show improvement.

Methods used of informing our residents of the voluntary watering stipulations were addressed, i.e. local television, cable, newspapers, newsletters, etc. Mr. Miller said letters have gone our to homeowners associations and some of our large users to comply with the ordinance and avoid watering during the peak hours. If we can get them to shift their watering times from 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and get them to push it forward from midnight until 5:00 a.m., it would be a great benefit. Detroit does not consider that as part of the peak hours.

Mrs. Filar asked is there any way to offer an incentive to those people who are willing to water off peak.

Mr. Schoenherr believes that would be hard to keep track of. Mr. Miller replied there is technology available to monitor this water usage; however, it would be an expense to the Township to have this available.

Mr. Wozniak suggested offering a credit to someone who purchases a meter so they go off peak. Mr. Miller said the Township does not have that technology available. This would encompass purchasing a new reading system or possibly going to radio reading, which will probably happen in the future.

Mr. Schoenherr said that communities that have mandatory watering in place are going after the big customers where they would get the biggest bang for their effort.

Mrs. Filar asked if we can discriminate – can we do that with commercial as opposed to residents. Mr. Flynn said that he will not be participating in this kind of conversation.

Mrs. Manzella feels if this information is on cable and in our newsletters, companies may not be aware of it. We need to get this information out. Most people that she has talked to weren't aware of the voluntary watering but had no problem changing their schedule.

# 3. Discussion and presentation of GOVAD with PRM Director, Library Director and GOVAD representative

Mr. Flynn advised this was a referral by the Township Attorney. A presentation was made to the Parks & Recreation Committee. They felt it was a good idea so it is being brought to the Board level for their consideration.

The presentation was made by Ms. Erlich representing GOVAD. The company was based on an idea of how we can tap into the resources that are available in the corporate world and drive them into our communities. She believes GOVAD will drive millions of dollars into global communities, create hundreds of jobs and fund the public programs and services.

She provided background on her company, with the list of clients they have worked with. They are aware that declining tax bases have led to increasing deficits, jobs cut and program and service cancellations. The public sector has traditionally been off limits. However, with the need being so great, there may be an opportunity to bring these two parties together.

GOVAD is a branded image integrated into public environments. She used KFC as an example. Someone from KFC who was a colonel look-alike went down the streets of Louisville, Kentucky filling pot holes. Once he filled the pot holes, "Refreshed by KFC" was stenciled in the asphalt. This provided much media coverage. Louisville got hundreds of potholes filled at no charge and Kentucky Fried Chicken received all of this exposure. It was a win win for both sides. This is a great example of a corporation and a public institution coming together to solve a problem.

More recently, the Royal Oak High School Marching Band Orchestra Booster Club had a significant budget shortfall. They found a partner in Royal Oak Ford, a nearby dealership, who in exchange for making up that shortfall in their budget put their logo on the drum skins. The story was covered by the local paper. It was a way for the marching band to continue their events, and the dealership received publicity. The positive public relations were well worth it. They did something good for the community.

GOVAD plans to build the platform – an eBay-like Auction Platform that will bring all of these parties together. They have relationships with the brands and they have been meeting with them. The public institution will list things they want to make available and the brands will come in and bid on the assets. The Township can make their assets more attractive to brands by letting them know what kind of consumers are here so their market dollars will be better spent. This is a community process.

While speaking to other communities, they have learned that local businesses would also like to make themselves visible to the citizens and be part of this opportunity.

An example used was a library. Libraries in the State of Michigan list inventory on the GOVAD website. Organizations such as Amazon.com and Barnes and Noble may be interested and bid against each other on the public rights to the libraries for a certain period of time. Local fulfillment suppliers connect with

Amazon for installation. Branding comes to life in the community. Everyone wins. Michigan libraries receive revenue. Amazon gets unique brand placement, and GOVAD earns money from Amazon and fulfillment suppliers.

Ms. Erlich addressed pilot program possibilities. This would allow naming rights to fields, parks, benches, scoreboards, golf carts, concessions and garbage and recycle bins.

Mr. Flynn added this is a pilot program. We can allow Joe Youngblood and Dave Conklin to work out the inventory subject to Board approval. GOVAD is looking for a non-binding letter of intent. We would have right of refusal as to what kind of companies we want to talk to. It may be places like Pepsi, Coca Cola, Kraft Food, Ford, GM, Chrysler, etc.

Mr. Stathakis said this falls under 2011 Township Priority #6 - New revenue sources.

Mrs. Filar understands this is a pilot program. Has it been done anywhere yet? Ms. Erlich stated not at this time. Mrs. Filar asked if they have competition and Ms. Erlich replied no. Mrs. Filar feels this is a great concept.

Mrs. Kowal also feels it is a great idea. She asked how long would the terms be? If we had Ford sponsor our baseball diamonds, how long would we have a contract with them? Would they be able to sell that again in two years?

Mr. Flynn said at the previous meeting, three years was used as a low end term. It could be something disposable like Library bookmarks which could be even shorter. The Board would have the say on it when it is set up.

Ms. Erlich said it may be specific to the asset. For instance a scoreboard has a high investment cost, so the brand would probably request a longer period to recoup their investment. There isn't one set term.

Mrs. Filar suggested that perhaps recycling cans be brought to our events. If someone is wiling to get us the containers with their logos placed on them, that would solve our problem.

Mr. Conklin would like this discussed with the Library Advisory Committee. He feels this is definitely worth exploring, especially in this financial climate.

Mr. Youngblood and the Parks & Recreation Committee members feel this is a great concept. This is the time to proceed based on the economy.

Mr. Flynn said they are looking for a non-binding letter of intent with no cost to the Township. He asked Mr. Stathakis if he would be willing to sign this document.

Mrs. Filar can't believe this is non-binding. She can't imagine Ms. Erlich going to Ford and saying that Shelby Township wants to participate and then later receiving a letter stating that we changed our mind. Mrs. Filar feels we have to offer a commitment. Mrs. Erlich said not at this point.

Mr. Flynn said the letter basically says Shelby Township thinks it is a good idea worth exploring.

Mr. Wozniak suggested that Mr. Stathakis have the contract reviewed by Rob Huth prior to signing it.

Mr. Stathakis agreed.

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MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY BOARD OF TRUSTEES HELD ON TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 2011 IN THE BOARD ROOM OF THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 52700 VAN DYKE, SHELBY TOWNSHIP, MICHIGAN.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Supervisor Richard Stathakis.

The invocation was led by Pastor Doc Ortman of St. John Vianney Catholic Church, 54045 Schoenherr followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by the Board of Trustees.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

Mr. Stathakis advised the audience that since a snow storm is in the forecast, he asked Parks & Recreation and DPW to put all ten of their trucks in service tomorrow morning. Sometime late tonight, depending on when the snow begins, a truck will be on the road plowing the municipal grounds, the community center, and parking lots of other Township buildings. He thanked the County for their cooperation in reimbursing Shelby Township for the expenses incurred which included our employees' labor, depreciation on our equipment and fuel for our vehicles. Mr. Stathakis also thanked Parks & Recreation and DPW for their planning and hard work in what might be a record breaking snow fall.

Police Chief Leman announced that about 2:00 p.m. this afternoon he called a Snow Emergency. It will be effective until Saturday, February 5 at 2:00 p.m. The intent is to have people remove their cars from the street and park them in either driveways or garages so the County and our personnel can get down side streets in the event of an emergency. If the streets are cleared prior to that time, the Snow Emergency will be lifted.

Mr. Stathakis stated that hopefully the Township Offices will be open tomorrow. If the snow is too deep, he will make a decision to close the offices about 7:00 a.m. tomorrow morning. This will be reflected on the main greeting when you call the offices.

Mr. Stathakis announced that he, along with Mayor Noonan of Utica and Mayor Notte of Sterling Heights, attended a Tri-County Luncheon. They each made a brief presentation to an audience of about 200 regarding what has been accomplished over the past couple of years and what they hoped to accomplish this year. This presentation will be on the Township website this Thursday. Mr. Stathakis appreciates everything that the Chamber of Commerce did to promote this event.

Mr. Flynn attended the MTA conference and provided a brief update. He informed the audience that he took several classes ranging from assessing, road repair, etc. It was very helpful for a non-career politician such as himself to get some insight into how government works and to be able to ask intelligent questions when we are spending taxpayer money. #### **PUBLIC HEARING**

1. 2011 Public Hearing for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Awards

Mr. Glenn Wynn, Planning Director, advised that the Township participates in the CDBG program through a partnership with Macomb County Planning and Economic

Development. The money received through the County is from the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development. This program has been in existence since the mid 1970's and funding can be used for three activities – to assist low and moderate income residents, to prevent slums or blight, or address other urban community needs.

We are limited to not more than 15% of our allocation to go toward public service. The anticipated funding level for this year is the same as last year - \$144,000. Our public service allocation is \$21,600. The County Board of Commissioners is allocating \$3,000 of that amount to the Macomb County Community Service Agency for their Chore Program. This lowers the amount available for public service to \$18,600.

Mr. Wynn provided the Board with a list of the public service agencies that have been pre-qualified by the County. He also provided a summary of the requests made this year together with each monetary amount. A breakdown of the distributions made during the past three or four years was also submitted.

Mr. Stathakis asked for the amount of funding to be allocated toward the project established to rectify a water problem we experienced about a year and a half ago in the southwest section of the Township. Mr. Wynn responded that last year we allocated \$126,000 plus some additional carryover funding. This project was estimated at \$300,000. This year, outside of the public service funding, we will have to allocate the balance from what we have left. We are making progress on this project, and it should be completed during this calendar year. An update should be available next month. They are currently working on easement acquisitions and preliminary engineering.

Representatives from the following agencies highlighted the services offered by their organizations and requested consideration for funding from the 2011 Community Development Block Grant Fund allocation.

#### **TOWNSHIP ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Mr. Flynn announced that as most Republicans are already aware, 26 states including the State of Michigan sued the Federal Government over "Obama Care". On Monday of this week a federal judge in Florida declared that law unconstitutional. Several

months ago a majority of the Board members, with the exception of himself and Mr. Viar, voted to participate in one of the first phases of this program known as the "early retiree reinsurance program". It is his understanding that we have already been approved for some funding under this program. His question to the Board and the Township Attorney is would it be prudent for us to hold up on spending that money until this issue has been resolved. His concern is if we spend this money, we may be obligated to repay it at some point. We may want to put those funds in a separate account until this issue is resolved.

Mr. Huth said it is his understanding that two district courts voted one way and two district courts voted the other way. At this point, not spending money is a good conservative rule but he doesn't think we have to make that decision based on the status of the current court cases.

### **FY 2011 Community Development Block Grant Allocations**

The Township Board conducted a public hearing on February 1, 2011 to obtain comments on the use of FY 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding. Completed applications are due that the county by no later than March 1, 2011.

### **Public Service Allocation**

Public service expenditures may not exceed fifteen (15) percent of the Township's annual CDBG allocation. Based on the anticipated allocation of \$144,000, the public service spending cap for this year is \$21,600. The County deducted \$3,000 from this allocation to fund the CHORE program administered by the Macomb County Community Services Agency. This leaves the Township with a balance of \$18,600 to allocate to other public service agencies that are requesting funding. A suggested allocation of public service funding for 2010 is shown in the following table.

The recommended public service allocation for FY 2011 reflects the past pattern with no major changes proposed to the core agencies that the Township has traditionally funded in recent years. All of these agencies have documented extensive service to township residents. If the Board chooses to fund any of the other non-profit organizations listed above, it will be necessary to reduce the funding levels to the other core agencies.

### **Project Administration**

The County allows communities to spend up to \$2,000 for administrative expenses. This covers the public hearing publication costs as well as a portion of our staff costs for administering the CDBG program at the local level.

### **Funding for New Projects**

CDBG funding available for new projects takes into account the FY 2011 allocation and the amount of money allocated for administration and public service. A funding summary for new projects is provided below.

The estimated cost of this project is \$330,000 which exceeds the available funding from any single program year. This project will require the allocation of CDBG funds over several years. Shelby Tech, Inc. vs. Charter Township of Shelby Revisions to Consent Judgment (outdoor soccer complex) for property located on the north side of 23 Mile Road between Schoenherr Road and Hayes Road

The attached letter from the project engineer proposes a change to the Consent Judgment approved by the Township Board in 2007 for the development of a senior housing complex consisting of 239 units. The terms of the Consent Judgment and the approved conceptual development plan for the site have been included for referenced purposes.

The subject property retains its underlying zoning classification of LM, Light Manufacturing. The property has 120 feet of frontage on 23 Mile Road and a depth of approximately one-half mile. Surrounding development consists of single family to the north, industrial to the west and vacant development to the east. The abutting property to the east has been approved for a mixed use planned unit development.

The concept plan submitted by the project engineer proposes several outdoor soccer fields, a concession/restroom building and a parking lot. The north portion of the site abutting Royal Forest Subdivision is heavily wooded and left undeveloped.

Outdoor recreation may be considered as a special land use in the LM, Light Manufacturing zoning district. If the Board concludes that this project has merit, further consideration of this development would require the submission of an application for special land use approval. This process requires a public hearing and site plan review by the Planning Commission with the notification of property owners within 300 feet of the site. Amendment of the Consent Judgment would occur at the conclusion of the special land use process if approved by the Township Board.

### **CONSENT JUDGMENT**

At a session of said Court, held in the Macomb County Court Building, located in the City of Mount Clemens, Macomb County, Michigan.

PRESENT: HONORABLE RICHARD L. CARETTI, Circuit Court Judge

UPON STIPULATION and consent of the parties, by and through their respective counsel, this Court finds:

- 1. Plaintiff, Shelby Tech, Inc. ("Plaintiff"), is a Michigan corporation conducting business in Macomb County, Michigan.
- Defendant, Charter Township of Shelby ("Township"), is a Michigan municipal corporation created pursuant to and in accordance with the statutes and constitution of the State of Michigan.
- 3. Plaintiff is the owner of certain real property ("Property") comprised of approximately 35 acres located in Shelby Township, Macomb County, Michigan, and more fully described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 4. The Property is, and at all times relevant hereto has been, zoned L-M (Light Manufacturing) in accordance with the Shelby Township Zoning Ordinance.
- 5. In 2006, Plaintiff filed an application for rezoning requesting the Township to rezone the Property from L-M (Light Manufacturing) to R-10 (Multiple-Family, Low Rise).
- 6. On or about June 14, 2006, the Shelby Township Planning Commission voted to recommend a denial of the rezoning request.
- 7. On or about August 1, 2006, the Shelby Township Board of Trustees voted to deny Plaintiff's application for rezoning.
- 8. On or about August 28, 2006, Plaintiff filed the present action challenging the Township's denial of the application for rezoning.
- 9. In order to avoid the expenditure of funds and the uncertainties of the outcome of the instant litigation, the parties have agreed to resolve this litigation through the entry of a Consent Judgment.
- 10. Upon the parties having received approval and authority for the entry of this Consent Judgment, including the Township through a vote of the Board of Trustees of the

Charter Township of Shelby, and the Court being otherwise fully advised in the premises;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

- A. Plaintiff's Property shall remain zoned L-M (Light Manufacturing). However, nothing in this Consent Judgment shall prohibit or preclude the Township from subsequently amending the zoning classification applicable to the Property, exercising its legislative discretion. Despite the current zoning or any amended zoning, the Property shall be developed, constructed and used in conformity with the Township's R-7 (Multiple-Family, Residential District) zoning district, the terms of this Consent Judgment and the Concept Plan attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference. Any reference to the term "Consent Judgment" herein shall also be deemed to include the Concept Plan. A large scale copy of the Concept Plan shall be kept on file at the Township. The uses provided for in this Consent Judgment shall be deemed legal conforming permitted uses, and Plaintiff shall have vested rights to such uses. In the event any of the buildings or structures are destroyed or damaged by fire or any other casualty, Plaintiff, its successors or assigns may rebuild same in accordance with the terms of this Consent Judgment.
- B. Development of the Property shall be restricted to senior apartment residences with building height not to exceed three (3) stories and ranch-style condominium residences as generally depicted on the Concept Plan attached hereto, marked Exhibit "B". A special land use approval for the senior citizen housing is hereby approved by this Consent Judgment. The total number of units permitted shall not exceed the following:
  - Senior Citizen Apartments 150 Units (75% Active/25% Inactive)

- Senior Citizen Single Family Condominiums 13 Units
- Senior Citizen Duplex Condominiums 32 Units
- Senior Citizen Quadplex Condominiums 44 Units

In no event shall the total number of units constructed on the Property exceed 239.

Plaintiff assumes the risk that the site plan review process may require the elimination of units in order to comply with various Ordinance requirements.

- C. Development of the Property as generally set forth in Exhibit "B" shall comply with the provisions of all applicable Township Ordinances and state laws as they presently exist or as they may be modified or amended from time to time, except that in the event any Ordinance provision shall conflict with any provision of this Consent Judgment at any time, the provisions of this Judgment shall apply.
- D. The Concept Plan attached as Exhibit "B" is intended to depict a conceptual development of senior housing only. Plaintiff shall be required to submit a detailed site plan to the Shelby Township Planning Commission in compliance with all applicable Township Ordinances. The Township shall process the site plan in its usual and customary manner under applicable Township ordinance provisions; however, Plaintiff shall not be required to submit a Development Impact Statement as specified in Section 7.04 of the Township Zoning Ordinance. Subsequent to site plan approval by the Shelby Township Planning Commission, minor changes to the site plan that do not increase density may be reviewed and approved administratively without an amendment of this Consent Judgment. Plaintiff shall not be permitted to apply to the Shelby Township Zoning Board of Appeals for any variances in connection with the site plan review process or development of the Property subsequent to site plan approval by the Planning Commission.

- E. Prior to the issuance of a building permit by the Township, Plaintiff must comply with all engineering and related Ordinance requirements contained in applicable Township Ordinances except as otherwise modified in this Consent Judgment. Building permits shall be processed and issued by the Township in its usual and customary manner, and shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- F. The parties agree to treat one another in good faith and no party will take or omit any action which will interfere with the spirit or intent of this Consent Judgment. The parties shall execute any and all documents that are necessary to carry out the intent of this Consent Judgment.
- G. This Consent Judgment is binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their heirs, personal representatives, successors and/or assigns.
- H. This Consent Judgment shall be recorded in the Office of the Macomb County Register of Deeds and shall be deemed a covenant running with the land.
- I. This Court retains continuing jurisdiction to assure compliance with the terms and conditions of this Consent Judgment.
- J. All claims asserted by Plaintiff against Defendant in this litigation are hereby merged into this Consent Judgment and forever barred. No party shall be entitled to costs or attorney fees.
- K. The terms of this Consent Judgment may be amended, changed, or modified but only upon entry of an Amendment to this Consent Judgment executed by all parties and entered with the Court.
- L. To the extent that this Consent Judgment is silent on issues governed by applicable Township Ordinances, the Ordinances shall control, provided that the

application of such Ordinances shall not reduce the permitted density or prevent development of the Property as contemplated by this Consent Judgment and Concept Plan.

M. The parties in this action represent to this Court that they have read this Consent Judgment, have discussed it with their legal counsel and fully understand the terms and conditions hereof. Each person signing this Consent Judgment on behalf of any party hereby represents and warrants that he/she is a duly authorized representative and agent of the respective party and he/she has full authority to bind such party to all the covenants, warranties, representations, terms and conditions of this Consent Judgment.

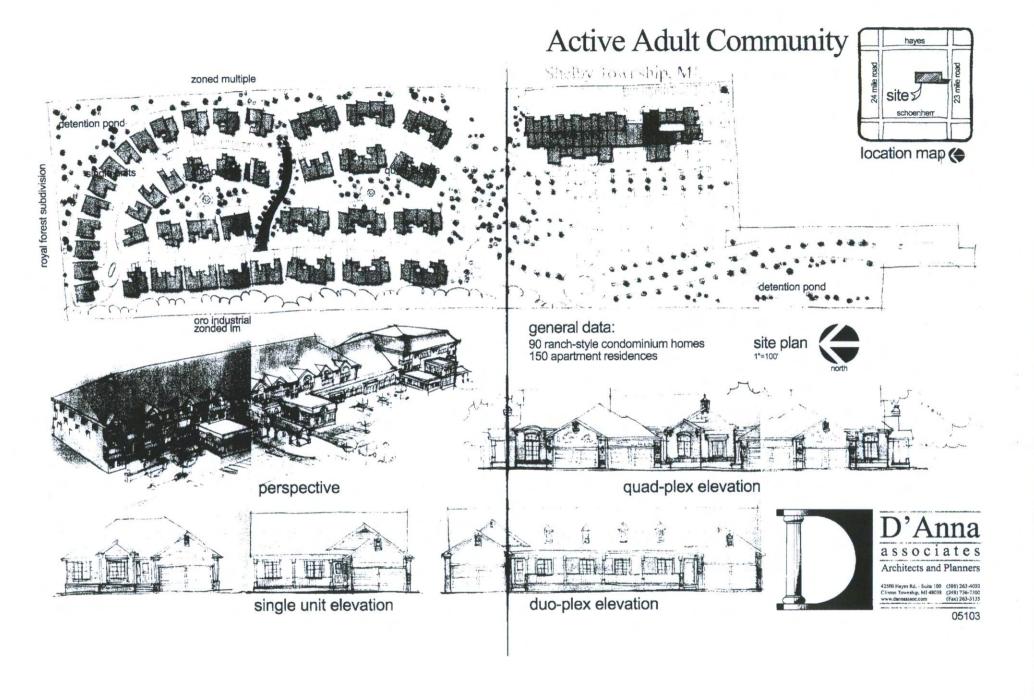

Re: Sidewalk Priorities - 2011

The Sidewalk Committee is pleased to report to the Township Board a list of proposed sidewalk construction projects for 2011. The proposed list includes eleven projects at locations distributed throughout the community. Projects proposed for this year primarily close gaps in the existing network of sidewalks. One of the goals of the Sidewalk Committee is to provide continuous, uninterrupted and safe pedestrian access throughout the community. The projects proposed for 2011 fulfill this goal.

The estimated cost of the projects for 2011 is approximately \$100,000 which is consistent with the budget allocation approved by the Board last year. The final cost will be determined when the projects are sent out for bid. The Committee's ability to complete all of these projects depends on the final construction costs and our ability to secure the required easements.

All eleven proposed projects are identified in the following table. Each project is also described in the narrative following the table. Aerial photos illustrating each project are provided at the conclusion of this report.

- **Project No. 1.** This project extends an existing sidewalk across three parcels between the Boys and Girls Club and Milonas Drive. Construction of these missing sidewalks would allow residents from several abutting single family subdivisions nearly one mile of continuous pedestrian access. It would also connect these neighborhoods with the retail development at the Hayes Road intersection.
- **Project No. 2.** The completion of this sidewalk would complete the existing sidewalk between the M-53 pedestrian bridge Whispering Woods Park.
- **Project No. 3.** This project encompasses two parcels located between the Post Office and the approved site for the nursing home to the west. When this sidewalk is completed and the abutting nursing home site is constructed, residents from the Central Park neighborhood to the west will be able to walk safely to the Post Office and the businesses along Van Dyke.
- **Project No. 4.** This project will complete a missing sidewalk along the frontage of the Coney Island restaurant at the corner of 25 Mile Road and Shelby Road. This missing segment of sidewalk is particularly important considering its proximity to the existing apartment complexes to the north and the Macomb Orchard Trail to the east.
- **Project No. 5.** This sidewalk extension encompasses a single family parcel between the Nottinghill mixed use project at the northwest corner of 24 Mile Road and Hayes and the Buckingham Forest Subdivision to the west.
- **Project No. 6.** This project extends a sidewalk from the entrance to the Shelby Orchard Subdivision to the sidewalk and pedestrian bridge to the west. Completion of this sidewalk will provide a continuous path between the Shelby Orchard Subdivision and Woodside Village Subdivision.
- **Project No. 7.** This project completes a small sidewalk gap on the West Utica Road between the gas station and the mini-storage site. The project also includes the installation of a guard rail adjacent to the sidewalk to protect users from a steep grade change.
- **Project No. 8.** This extension involves the construction of a sidewalk from 24 Mile Road south across the frontage of two professional office sites. Sidewalks are widely available along both Mound Road and 24 Mile Road in the vicinity of this intersection. Since this site is already developed, the township has limited opportunity to require the existing property owners to install a sidewalk. The completion of this sidewalk will assist a visually impaired resident who is a frequent sidewalk user. Adequate right-of-way is available to accommodate the installation of a sidewalk without any additional property acquisition.
- **Project No. 9.** This project extends handicap access ramps north to 26 Mile Road and west to Van Dyke. The other three corners of this intersection include handicapped ramps. Completion of the ramps will allow for pedestrian access across 26 Mile Road to the north and west across Van Dyke.
- **Project No. 10.** Currently there are two missing sidewalks on the south side of 24 Mile Road on either side of the entrance to Seven Oaks Subdivision (Seven Oaks Drive). This project would provide a connection to the existing sidewalks along 24 Mile Road to the east. The project also requires a drain crossing.

• **Project No. 11.** The Kingsway Apartments on the north side of 25 Mile Road were constructed in the 1960's before the installation of sidewalks was a requirement of site plan approval. Existing residential projects to the east and west have installed sidewalks. Completion of this connection would provide a continuous sidewalk from the Mound Road intersection east for a distance of approximately 1,700 feet.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 260**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 22 ARTICLE III OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE PURPOSES OF REQUIRING REIMBURSEMENT FOR MEDICAL SERVICES RECEIVED BY THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE IN CUSTODY BY OR AT THE DIRECTION OF THE TOWNSHIP.

#### IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY:

<u>Section 1</u> Article III, Section 22-72 of the Code of Ordinances, Charter Township of Shelby, Michigan shall be amended to read as follows

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Ambulance service means the use of an authorized vehicle for transportation, or transportation and treatment, on an emergency basis, of patients.

*Emergency* means a condition or situation in which an individual declares a need for immediate medical attention, or where such need is declared by emergency medical personnel or a public safety official.

Individuals who are in custody means any person held in custody, confined or incarcerated by the Township, including but not limited to individuals who are i) under arrest, ii) incarcerated, iii) imprisoned iv) escaped from confinement v) under supervised release vi) on medical furlough vii) residing in a mental health facility or halfway house, viii) living under home detention, ix) or confined completely or partially in any way under a penal statute or rule.

(Code 1974, § 1-02.02; Ord. No. 232, 11-20-2001)

Cross references: Definitions generally, § 1-2.

<u>Section 2</u>. Article III, Section 22-74 of the Code of Ordinances, Charter Township of Shelby, Michigan shall be amended to read as follows:

- (a) Fire department personnel.
- (1) *Not responsible for collection*. Fire department personnel shall not be responsible for the collection of any service fee.

- (2) To provide service regardless. Services shall be provided without regard to whether any such person is financially able to or will pay the fee.
- (3) *Maintain records*. The fire department shall maintain a record of all patients receiving emergency ambulance service. Such records shall, within 30 days such service is rendered, be turned over to the township's independent billing agent.
- (b) *Billing agent*.
- (1) Statement of services to users. The township appointed independent billing agent shall mail to any user of the ambulance service a statement showing the services rendered, and the amount of the fee to be charged. The fees authorized by this section shall be determined by resolution of the township board and shall be a reasonable pro rata compensatory charge based upon the average cost per run as determined by Township records.
- (2) *Users with insurance coverage*. If it appears that any such user has a policy of insurance which would pay for such service, the statement may be mailed directly to the insurance company involved, in accordance with the billing practices of that company.
- (3) *Collection records*. The treasurer shall maintain appropriate records indicating all persons to whom such statements were mailed and the fee which was collected.
- (4) *Delinquent accounts*. Any such user who does not remit the service fee within 120 days of the date of billing shall have his account forwarded to a third party collection agency for appropriate legal action.
- (5) Deposit of fees. All net fees collected by the independent billing agent shall be deposited by the township treasurer to the appropriate account as required by law.

(Code 1974, § 1-02.04; Ord. No. 232, 11-20-2001)

<u>Section 3.</u> Article III, Section 22-76 of the Code of Ordinances, Charter Township of Shelby, Michigan is hereby created to read as follows:

Medical Treatment of individuals who are in custody.

Individuals who are in custody shall be solely responsible for the payment of any medical services rendered to, and received by, that individual during the course of his or her confinement with the Township, or at the Township's or Court's direction, including without limitation transportation to and from a medical treatment facility, and any treatment deemed necessary by his or her treating

physician, whether or not requested by the individual in custody and shall be required to reimburse the Township, in full for any fees or charges incurred for such services, if not paid directly to medical facility or practitioner by the individual in custody or his or her insurance carrier.

<u>Section 4</u>. Article III, Section 22-133 of the Code of Ordinances, Charter Township of Shelby, Michigan shall be amended to read as follows:

It shall be presumed that a person was operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of an alcoholic liquor when his blood contains an amount of 0.08 percent or more by weight of alcohol. The blood alcohol content may be determined by a chemical analysis of the blood, urine or breath of the person.

### Section 10. SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent portion of this Ordinance, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

### Section 11. REPEAL

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

### Section 12. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from the date of publication hereof.

The meeting was called to order at 5:02 p.m. by Chairman Matt Stachowicz.

### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

**MOTION** by Semaan, supported by Stachowicz, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Charter Township of Shelby Fire & Police Pension and Retirement Board held on October 18, 2010, as submitted. Motion carried.

**MOTION** by Viar, supported by Semaan, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Charter Township of Shelby Fire & Police Pension and Retirement Board held on November 15, 2010, as submitted.

Motion carried.

**MOTION** by Moffitt, supported by Semaan, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Charter Township of Shelby Fire & Police Pension and Retirement Board held on December 14, 2010, as submitted. Motion carried.

### **PRESENTATION**

Mrs. Rebecca Wolfe reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the month ending December 31, 2010. The beginning market value was \$49,189,801. There

were withdrawals during the month of December in the amount of \$658,049. Interest and dividends that were credited during the month totaled \$120,781. The positive gains reflected during the month were \$1,698,089. The ending market value as of December 31, 2010 totaled \$50,350,622.

The bottom portion of the Treasurer's Report reflects pension payments made on December 1 representing the December, 2010 payment and on December 31 representing the January, 2011 payment. Even after the distributions were made, there was still a positive gain for the month which included interest and market appreciation.

Mrs. Wolfe distributed an update on the market values as of January 21, 2011. The market values continued to increase to \$51,113,763. Mrs. Wolfe highlighted the asset allocation vs. the target The total equities are 67.7% of the overall portfolio vs. a target of 65%. Fixed income is at 32.3% vs. a target of 35%.

Mr. Brice briefly reviewed the Monthly Performance Monitor for the month of December reflecting total equities up 6.68%.

He also highlighted pertinent information contained in the Market Focus for the fourth quarter of 2010. He anticipates seeing a double digit total rate of return for last year.

Investors appeared more confident in the fourth quarter, bidding up riskier assets such as equities and lower-quality bonds. Investments that were considered safer, such as Treasury and Municipal bonds, posted a negative return in the fourth quarter. Overall, the entire taxable bond market fell 1.3% in the fourth quarter and increased 6.8% for the year.

Mr. Brice pointed out the market rate returns for equities, fixed income and global equities for the fourth quarter in comparison to overall return for 2010.

Mr. Brice indicated that more detail will be presented at the February Pension Board meeting when the Investment Performance Analysis Report for the quarter ending December 31, 2010 will be discussed.

**MOTION** by Moffitt, supported by Diegel, to accept the Treasurer's Report, as presented.

Motion carried.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

"Draft Letter" from Attorney Lou Thumm RE Financial Management Administrative Fee

Mr. Semaan advised at the November meeting the letter from Financial Management regarding the \$33,564.66 administrative fee being charged to the Pension Board was addressed. It was agreed at that time that this matter would be referred to Mr. Thumm, the Pension Board Attorney for an opinion, which was received and discussed at the December meeting. Subsequent to that meeting, Financial Management was asked for a breakdown of the charges. Mr. Semaan distributed the information he received from Financial Management for the Board's review.

Mr. Semaan briefly explained the submittal. He was told by Financial Management that the percentages would be the same for all three years for the categories listed. This is the only information that is available. They didn't release any other information explaining how their costs to us were broken down. This submittal was forwarded to Mr. Thumm and he responded in the "draft letter" Mr. Semaan presented to the Board. The letter states what the Pension Board feels are reasonable and unreasonable costs. Mr. Thumm asked for input from the Pension Board. He asked if they wanted him to proceed with sending this letter to the Township Board or if the members have any suggested changes.

Mr. Diegel asked if the issue is that the amount is retroactive. Mr. Semaan responded in part. He feels this number was submitted without any breakdown of hours. If they are going to charge the Pension Board, Mr. Semaan feels they should keep track of their hours. We can't pay a bill based on percentages of Financial Management's budget.

Mr. Diegel advised this is done at the County level as well. They would allocate costs based on different factors, i.e. percent of square footage, number of employees, etc. Items would be charged back to the user departments.

Mr. Semaan advised Act 345 states if we are going to be charged for a service, we should contract for that service and know the amount we are responsible for in advance. In this instance, they have done this for years and always absorbed the cost. Now they decided everyone will pay a share of whatever Financial Management is doing without knowing the cost and not having a chance to contract this work out.

Mr. Viar asked if the Board is willing to pay for the audit. Mr. Semaan responded if that is something we have to do then perhaps we should look into it. Mr. Semaan said this becomes a mute point when you look at the amount the Township still owes us. Mr. Viar says if you want to assess the taxpayers this amount, that is your right.

Mr. Viar asked what the Pension Board will agree to pay. Mr. Semaan responded he will be happy to pay the Clerk's Office because we definitely use the secretary on a monthly basis.

Mr. Viar asked if he can negotiate a reasonable settlement with the Township will the Pension Board agree. He asked for a week to do so.

The Board said absolutely. Mr. Stachowicz stated this can be tabled until the next Pension meeting. Mr. Semaan asked that they come up with a reasonable bill and provide justification and not just percentages. Mr. Viar said he will come up with a figure that everyone can live with.

Mr. Moffitt said Mr. Semaan made the point that the Township has to make the plan whole. Really it is Peter robbing Peter. Ultimately they will have to reimburse the fund to make the system whole. Mr. Viar said this has nothing to do with the shortfall of the pension. Mr. Semaan said no it doesn't but it increases the shortfall of the pension fund and you still have to make that up.

**MOTION** by Semaan, supported by Moffitt, to have Mr. Viar come back to the next meeting with a reasonable bill from Financial Management.

Motion carried.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Mr. Brice from Merrill Lynch presented the Fire & Police Pension and Retirement System 2011 Investment Meeting Schedule. The members were in agreement with the dates presented.

It was agreed that the next Pension Board meeting will be held on Wednesday, February 16, 2011 at 5:00 p.m.

The secretary was asked to send a reminder to the members.

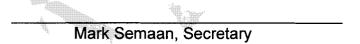
