MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY BOARD OF TRUSTEES HELD ON TUESDAY, JULY 19, 2011 IN THE BOARD ROOM OF THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 52700 VAN DYKE, SHELBY TOWNSHIP, MICHIGAN.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Supervisor Richard Stathakis.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Pastor Hal Barringer of Lakeside Assembly of God, 46155 Schoenherr, followed by a brief invocation.

AWARDS & PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Stathakis informed the audience that a section of the Township, including the municipal building, had an interruption of power for approximately 3 ½ hours this afternoon as a result of a semi truck hitting a utility pole at 25 Mile Road and Van Dyke.

Shelby Township is setting up a cooling center at the Shelby Manor Clubhouse located at 13960 Lakeside Boulevard North on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, July 20, 21, and 22 from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Free bottled water will be provided along with games and TV viewing. This initiative is targeted for the elderly who do not have air conditioning.

David Conklin, our Library Director, invited those who want to keep cool to visit the Library and read a good book.

Mr. Stathakis advised that he intended to present a quick overview of the Township's budget this evening which would have included the general fund, police fund, fire fund and DPW. Because of the power outage mishap this afternoon, the information could not be transmitted to the Board Room. This information will be discussed at a future meeting.

PUBLIC HEARING

1. GS ROUSSILLON, LLC – Establishment of an Industrial Development District, 51870 Shelby Parkway

MOTION by Kowal, supported by Manzella, to open the public hearing to discuss the establishment of an Industrial Development District and the application for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate at 51870 Shelby Parkway.

Motion carried.

The public hearing was opened at 7:09 p.m.

Mr. Jim Ahee from Macomb County Planning and Economic Development was in attendance supporting Kuka Robotics' request for an IFEC.

Mr. Ahee explained the abatement procedure. Public Act 198 of 1974 provides an exemption to manufacturing companies to encourage the renovation and expansion of their existing facilities, assist in the building of a new facility as well as investing in new equipment. This was done to encourage companies to stay in Michigan and create new jobs. The new investment is taxed at a lower level for a period of 1 to 12 years, depending on what the Board of Trustees decides. All of the current taxes stay in place, and the reduction only affects the new investments. The community is benefitting because even if it is at a lower level, there is still new tax revenue generated for the community.

In this particular instance, Kuka Robotics is intending to move their headquarters to Shelby Township from Clinton Township. They will continue to pay all the personal property taxes on their current equipment and machinery. The improvements to the building, new machinery and equipment will qualify for the IFEC. As they move into the community, they will generate taxes and as they continue to invest in their business, this will increase revenue to the Township. In addition to the revenue, there will also be new jobs coming into the Township. Kuka Robotics is planning to invest over \$3 Along with this investment, they intend to hire approximately 10 million in this facility. additional employees and retain their current staff of 68 employees. These are all high-paid, well-educated engineers. This is the type of company everyone would like to have in their area. It is very high-tech, well diversified and advanced manufacturing.

As an international company, Kuka Robotics could have made its investment anywhere in the world. Michigan was competing with Ohio and Georgia for Kuka Robotics' headquarters. Mr. Ahee advised that he got the state involved because this is the type of company that the state and county desires. By granting this abatement, they would be qualified for additional state incentives. Today they received final approval for their Mega Tax Credit from the state. All that is left as part of the process is local support.

Mr. Ahee indicated this company is very well diversified. About four or five years ago, this company was basically an automotive supplier. Today, under the leadership of Mr. Shepherd, President of the company, Kuka Robotics totally changed their direction. They are involved in aerospace, the entertainment industry, alternative energy, consumer products, and medical devices.

Kuka Robotics constantly brings customers and clients into the area for training. These are people that come in while they are being trained, spend the night, shop, go to the movies, dine at local restaurants, etc. They are a large generator of economic activity.

Mr. Ahee feels if this abatement is granted, it is a win for the company since they will receive a reduction in their taxes and a win for Shelby Township because Kuka Robotics will occupy a building that has remained vacant for nearly 10 years. It is a speculative building, and the Township will finally have a chance to generate income at that location.

 GS ROUSSILLON, LLC requests the establishment of an Industrial Development District, 51870 Shelby Parkway. Mr. Stathakis stated this is an 80,000 square foot industrial building. The outside is complete; however, the interior is not finished. It has dirt floors, no heating and no plumbing. The portions of the building that are complete and the land that it occupies would not be subject to abatement and would be subject to the full rate of taxation. If the Board approves this request, the applicant has indicated that they will move their world headquarters to Shelby Township. Sixty six employees will be transferred to this new facility and approximately nine or ten new employees will be hired within the next two years.

Memorandum of a Resolution adopted at a regular meeting of the Township Board of the Charter Township of Shelby, Macomb County, Michigan, held in the Township Municipal Building, 52700 Van Dyke Avenue, Shelby Township, Michigan 48316 on **July 19, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.**, Eastern Standard Time.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by <u>Filar</u> and supported by Member <u>Kowal.</u>

Whereas, GS Roussillon LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner", has requested the Township Board establish an Industrial Development District pursuant to the provisions of Act No. 198 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended, hereafter referred to as "Act 198".

Whereas, the Charter Township of Shelby is a local governmental unit empowered to establish an Industrial Development District pursuant to Act 198;

Whereas, Petitioner is the owner of greater than seventy-five (75%) percent of the state equalized value of the industrial property located within the proposed Industrial Development District;

Whereas, the Township Board established July 19, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. as the date and time and the Township Municipal Building located at 52700 Van Dyke Avenue, Shelby Township, Macomb County, Michigan as the place for the holding of a public hearing on the question of whether an Industrial Development District should be established pursuant to the request of the Petitioner;

Whereas, the Township Board has given written notice of said hearing by certified mail to the owner of all real property within the proposed Industrial Development District and has caused notice of said hearing to be published on **July 10, 2011** in the SOURCE, a newspaper of general circulation with the Charter Township of Shelby.

Whereas, the Township Board has heard the comments of the owner of said real property, residents and taxpayers of the Township and others with respect to the establishment of an Industrial Development District; and,

Whereas, the Township Board finds that the request for the establishment of the Industrial Development District was filed before commencement of construction, alteration or installation of, or of an acquisition related to, a proposed new facility.

Whereas, the Township Board approves said Industrial Development District. The Industrial Development District will expire upon the expiration, withdrawal, or revocation of any active Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Board of the Charter Township of Shelby, Macomb County, Michigan:

- That the Township Board hereby deems the establishment of an Industrial Development District to be beneficial to the residents of the Charter Township of Shelby.
- 2. That said District may result in increased employment and an eventual and substantial increase in the state equalized valuation of the Charter Township of Shelby.
- 3. That an Industrial Development District is hereby established pursuant to the provisions of Act No. 198 with the boundaries of said district being solely confined to the following described land situated in the Township of Shelby, County of Macomb, State of Michigan, to wit:

6. KUKA ROBOTICS CORPORATION requests an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, 51870 Shelby Parkway.

Mr. Stathakis stated that Kuka Robotics Corporation has informed us that it is one of the world's largest robotic manufacturers. The company is upgrading its facilities and operations to prepare for a business expansion and has asked for approval of an IFEC from the Township to help streamline their operation, increase their cost efficiencies and make the company more competitive both domestically and internationally.

MOTION by Flynn, supported by Manzella, to adopt the Resolution approving the Application for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate for KUKA ROBOTICS Corporation at 51870 Shelby Parkway, as presented, for a period of 5 years.

Mr. Stuart Shepherd, President of Kuka Robotics, conducted a slide presentation highlighting the history of their company and operations undertaken at their current facility. They continue to invest and educate their workers in all of the new technology.

Mr. Shepherd informed the audience that Kuka Robotics also generates 4,000 overnight stays per year. This amounts to approximately \$150 per person being spent in the community for hotel rooms, restaurants, rental cars and other activities. If they host an event such as the one they are considering for Cherry Creek Golf Club, it could be significantly greater than that. They have a number of people coming in which include employees, customers and students. Kuka Robotics provides training at their location and has about 36 students per week coming through their building. They plan on increasing that to 60 students once they are settled in their new location. They can also improve Shelby Township's high-tech technology image to attract other businesses in new and emerging markets. Across the street from their proposed site is Eagle Manufacturing. Their company uses robotic automation and they are developing a relationship with them and others in Shelby Township to help boost the overall competitiveness of communities in the area.

Kuka Robotics is ready to move immediately as soon as the paperwork is in place. They will be able to start pouring concrete and making improvements to a building that has been empty and not generating income since 2001.

The site chosen and the environment works well for Kuka Robotics. It is a great looking industrial park and presents well from the highway.

Kuka Robotics is looking for a five-year lease with an option to extend. Their investment in this building would be at least \$645,000 plus they anticipate putting in an additional \$800,000 in capital equipment and other improvements over the next four or five years. This is not a short-term, one shot deal. It is an investment by their company. They intend to hire at least 25 people during a five-year period of time as the economy improves.

They can help solicit other German companies and other robotic automation companies to come to this area. Kuka Robotics can make Shelby Township known throughout the world. They issue press releases at least monthly and their stamp will say "Shelby Township, Michigan". Every presentation that they make will say Shelby Township, which will bring a good positive image to them as well to our community.

Mr. Shepherd also believes Kuka Robotics can offer other support to help develop business. They would like to offer their sponsorship and facilitation of a business development council to help attract other businesses.

They also support education and offer lecturers, career days, field trip days, etc.

Besides regular employment, Kuka Robotics offers internships and cooperative education opportunities.

The following preamble and resolution was offered by Member <u>Flynn</u> and supported by Member Manzella.

WHEREAS, KUKA ROBOTICS Corporation, has requested the Township Board of the Charter Township of Shelby approve its Application for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate pursuant to the provisions of Act 198, Public Acts of 1974, as amended;

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Shelby is a local governmental unit empowered to establish Industrial Development Districts pursuant to Act 198, Public Acts of 1974, as amended;

WHEREAS, the Township Board on July 19, 2011, by Resolution established an Industrial Development District pursuant to the petition of the titleholder, GS Roussillon, LLC. a Michigan Limited Liability Corporation.

WHEREAS, KUKA ROBOTICS Corporation, as a lessee/owner, will continue to occupy the facility situated within the aforesaid duly established Industrial Development

District and has the obligation to pay all ad valorem real and personal property taxes levied thereon;

- **WHEREAS**, said Application relates to New Personal Property that when purchased and installed constitutes a new facility within the meaning of the aforesaid Act which shall be situated within the aforesaid duly established Industrial Development District;
- **WHEREAS**, completion of the proposed facility is calculated to, and will at the time of issuance of the proposed Certificate have a reasonable likelihood of creating employment within the Charter Township of Shelby;
- **WHEREAS**, completion of the proposed facility does not constitute merely the addition of machinery and equipment for the purpose of increasing productive capacity, but rather is a new facility with acquisition of new machinery, equipment, furniture and fixtures;
- **WHEREAS**, the Township Board established **July 19, 2011** at 7:00 p.m. as the date and time and the Shelby Township Offices located at 52700 Van Dyke Avenue, Shelby Township, Michigan 48316, as the place for the holding of a public hearing on the question of whether the aforesaid Application should be approved;
- **WHEREAS**, the Township Clerk of the Charter Township of Shelby has given written notice of said public hearing to the assessor of the Charter Township of Shelby and to the legislative body of each taxing unit which levies ad valorem property taxes in the Charter Township of Shelby, and has published a notice of said public hearing in a newspaper of general circulation with the Charter Township of Shelby;
- **WHEREAS**, the Township Board has afforded the applicant, the assessor, representatives of the affected taxing units, all residents and taxpayers of the Charter Township of Shelby an opportunity to be heard in person or by written communication as to whether the aforesaid Application should be approved; and,
- WHEREAS, the Township Board has been informed that the taxable value of the property proposed to be exempt pursuant to the aforesaid Application when considered together with the aggregate taxable value of property exempt under certificates previously granted and currently in force, does not exceed five (5%) percent of the taxable value of the Charter Township of Shelby.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY, MACOMB COUNTY, MICHIGAN:

- 1. That the Township Board finds and determines that the granting of an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate to **KUKA ROBOTICS Corporation**, when considered together with the aggregate amount of Industrial Facility Exemption Certificates previously granted and currently in force under Act No. 198 of the Public Acts of 1974 and Act No. 255 of the Public Acts of 1978, shall not have the effect of substantially impeding the operation of the Charter Township of Shelby, or impairing the financial soundness of a taxing unit which levies an ad valorem property tax in the Charter Township of Shelby;
- 2. That the Township Board hereby approves the Application for Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate filed by **KUKA ROBOTICS Corporation**, as a lessee of a new facility for a period of <u>five (5)</u> years, effective **December 31, 2011**;
- 3. That in the event the aforesaid Application for Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, when considered together with the aggregate taxable value of property exempt under certificates previously granted and currently in force exceeds five (5%) percent of the taxable value of the Charter Township of Shelby, the Township Board urges the State Tax Commission, with the approval of the State Treasurer, to make a finding and include a statement in the order approving said Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, that the same, if granted, shall not have the effect of substantially

impeding the operation of the Charter Township of Shelby or impairing the financial soundness of any affected taxing units;

4. That in accordance with Section 22 of Act 198, Public Acts of 1974, as amended, that a written agreement between the Applicant and the Charter Township of Shelby, shall be filed with the Department of Treasury in the form as executed and attached to this Resolution.

7. PLANNING & ZONING DIRECTOR requests:

a. authorization to accept responsibility for the relocation of the Section
 30 Drain located in Ryan Road right-of-way.

Mr. Glenn Wynn, Planning Director, provided an update on the status of the Section 30 drainage project. It has been a complex project that has taken considerable time and effort to reach the point where we are today. An income survey was completed to qualify the project for block grant funding. A master engineered drainage plan was designed for the area together with a significant acquisition of easements. engineering for the project is nearly complete and we are ready to start the bidding The principal easement for the project has already been acquired by Mr. Schoenherr that will run east and west from the lake to the Ryan Road right-of-way. The final easement that is needed is for about 400 feet along the west side of Ryan The Macomb County Department of Roads agreed to allow us to use their right-of-way, which is about 66 feet so we can avoid obtaining another easement. The County asked that the Township agree that if in the future Ryan Road is ever widened, we would be responsible for doing that 400 foot section. He talked to the County many times and they felt that the likelihood of that happening is very slim. plans to widen Ryan Road significantly, there is a bridge crossing so the environmental conditions are such that it is almost an impossibility. Nevertheless, the Road Commission needs something in their file that would obligate the Township to be responsible for relocating that portion of the drain if the widening of Ryan ever occurred which is very unlikely.

MOTION by Manzella, supported by Viar, to authorize the Supervisor to send a letter to the Macomb County Department of Roads accepting the responsibility of relocating that portion of the Section 30 drain located in the Ryan Road right-of-way if the road is widened in the future.

An application was submitted for permits today with the Macomb County Department of Roads and Macomb County Public Works Soil Erosion Department. Her office expects a speedy turnaround. They plan on advertising for bids within the next three to four weeks and accept bids for award at the September 6 Board meeting. They would like to construct the project in the fall because of ground water levels.

Motion carried.

b. approval to proceed with modifications to Consent Judgment entitled Hallmark Development Company vs. Charter Township of Shelby, et al

Mr. Wynn believes we have another exciting economic development opportunity. We were recently approached by a representative of U.S. Farathane regarding the potential expansion of their business. They are located at 11650 Park Court in the M-53/23 Mile Road Corporate Industrial Subdivision south of 23 Mile Road east of the M-53 Freeway. They currently have a 90,000 square foot building and are anticipating doubling the size of that building. Expansion will be about \$3.6 million with an addition of \$10.5 million in personal property and about 50 new jobs. The challenge with this particular site is they are limited in their expansion. They don't have sufficient area on their existing lot to accommodate expansion of that size. The parcel does abut the undeveloped northerly portion of what is known as Lombardo Park, which borders the freeway. The owners of the property inquired whether or not the possibility of expanding into this vacant property utilizing about 4 acres of a 34-acre site is feasible. Lombardo Park and the Shelby West Mobile Home Park expansion were approved through a Consent Judgment by the Board in 1998. The proposed building expansion would require the modification of that Consent Judgment and approval by the Township; Shelby Forest Associates, the mobile home park; and Hallmark Corporation, which was the developer of the industrial subdivision. With the assistance of Mr. Kirk, Mr. Huth's partner, they organized a meeting several weeks ago of all parties to see if they could establish the framework where they could reach some type of agreement. Farathane is now negotiating with the property owner to purchase that property. Wynn wanted to present to the Board background on this case to determine if there is any interest in amending that Consent Judgment to allow for a portion of that recreation site to be developed for this purpose. Most of the developed portion of the park including the ball diamonds, the comfort station and the parking is located on the southern half of the site near 22 Mile Road. The northern half was always planned for passive recreation. Mr. Wynn has spoken to Mr. Youngblood multiple times and he is open to this idea. There are no immediate plans to extend any improvements to that portion of the park. Mr. Wynn is not asking for any action of the Board at this time. He wanted to see if there is any interest in us pursuing this negotiation with all of the parties and coming back to the Board for the framework for a new Consent Judgment. Because of the time frame involved, this would include the site plan for expansion of the U.S. Farathane is on a fairly tight time frame which he feels we can accommodate if everyone works together expeditiously.

MOTION by Filar, supported by Viar, to refer the proposal to modify the Consent Judgment entitled Hallmark Development Company vs. Charter Township of Shelby, et al back to the Planning and Zoning Department and Township Attorney to review the feasibility of revising the consent judgment for reconsideration by the Township Board. Motion carried.

DEPARTMENTAL & COMMITTEE

8. SUPERVISOR requests authorization for the MCDR to proceed with road projects in years 2012, 2013 and 2014.

MOTION by Flynn, supported by Viar, to authorize the MCDR to move forward with the Township TIP Auburn Road Reconstruction Project as proposed from Dequindre to Ryan Road, noting that the cost for this TIP Project shall be \$440,000.00, to be shared equally with the MCDR. As a result, the Board of Trustees acknowledges and concurs that funding (\$220,000.00) for this TIP Project must therefore be included in the Year 2012 Township Budget – Line Item 101 442 967 200, with formal Board of Trustees' approval of the final Cost Share Agreement to be made at a later date. Motion carried.

MOTION by Filar, supported by Flynn, to authorize the MCDR to move forward with the Township TIP Van Dyke Widening Project from 25 to 26 Mile Road as proposed, noting that the total cost for this TIP Project shall be \$895,643.50, to be shared equally with the MCDR. As a result, the Board of Trustees acknowledges and concurs that funding

(\$447,821.50) for this Township TIP Project must therefore be included in the Year 2013 Township Budget – Line Item 101 442 967 200, with formal Board of Trustees' approval of the final Cost Share Agreement to be made at a later date.

Mrs. Thurber pointed out that \$447,821.50 is only 10% of the total project cost. The other 10% is matched by the Macomb County Department of Roads and the remaining 80% is federal funding.

Mrs. Kowal asked why we need to agree to do this now and say that we are going to include it in our budget now for 2013.

Mrs. Thurber responded that we need to commit for the Transportation Improvement Program. The Macomb County Department of Roads needs to allocate funding ahead of time. This fall, we will be planning on the 2015 projects.

Mrs. Manzella also has concerns with the extent of this funding allocation. If we agree to this, how bound are we to go ahead with this money in 2013. The next motion is committing funds for 2014. Her concern is that we had Plante Moran do our audit and they suggested that 2014 is going to be the most difficult year we are facing. She doesn't want to commit to spending this kind of money when we don't know the amount of funding we will be working with in 2014.

Mr. Stathakis said there is no need to be concerned. He talked with the Road Department, and he was assured this is for planning purposes. If we don't commit to this now, they will move on to another community. On the other hand, if something happens in 2013 and we cannot make this obligation we are not obligated to pay this money. Mr. Stathakis would like the Board to assure the County that our intent is to have this road widening done. It is very important to our community to have good roads, and we have to commit to spending money and investing in good roads.

Mrs. Manzella stated she is all in favor of road improvements and if this is just for planning purposes and not committing us to a particular dollar amount that far into the future, she would be able to support the motion.

Mrs. Thurber said the final Cost Share Agreement will come before the Board at the time the project is ready to begin.

Mrs. Kowal said the confusion is a result of the motion stating it must be included in the budget even though the project will be done later.

Mr. Stathakis said there have been many costs in the budget that this Board has cut. These are spending guides and not commitments.

Mrs. Filar reminded the Board that this is 10% of the actual cost of the Van Dyke widening project between 25 Mile and 26 Mile.

Mrs. Manzella stated if we are getting 80% from federal funding, that is huge. However, we have to keep in mind those are also tax dollars and this is a \$4 million dollar project. She felt that it warrants some of type of explanation and discussion before we approve this.

Motion carried.

MOTION by Wozniak, supported by Viar, to authorize the MCDR to move forward with the Township TIP 25 Mile Road Reconstruction Project from Van Dyke to Mound Road as proposed, noting that the total cost for this TIP Project shall be \$440,000.00, to be shared equally with the MCDR. As a result, the Board of Trustees acknowledges and concurs that funding (\$220,000.00) for this Township TIP Project must therefore be included in the Year 2014 Township Budget – Line Item 101 442 967 200, with formal Board of Trustees' approval of the final Cost Share Agreement to be made at a later date.

Gary Golasa, 4815 Kings Row, expressed his comments regarding this issue.

Motion carried.

9. POLICE CHIEF requests to purchase an in-car camera system.

MOTION by Viar, supported by Manzella, to concur with the recommendation of Police Chief Robert Leman and approve the purchase of a new In-Car Camera System from Panasonic for a total cost of \$138,034.60 with installation to be performed by Cynergy Wireless Products Inc. at a total cost of \$6,875.00. The system and installation total is \$144,909.60 and will be paid for from the following line items:

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MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY BOARD OF TRUSTEES HELD ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 20, 2011 IN THE LOBBY CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 52700 VAN DYKE, SHELBY TOWNSHIP, MICHIGAN.

The work session was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Supervisor Richard Stathakis.

1. Discussion regarding Shelby Manor Cable Service

Mrs. Kowal advised that Comcast Cable made a presentation regarding cable for Shelby Manor. Attorney Neil Lehto drafted an agreement between Comcast and the Township. Copies of the agreement and additional backup were submitted to the Board members for their review. Mrs. Kowal wanted the Board members to be aware of this to make sure no one objected to having Comcast come into Shelby Manor.

Shelia Darga representing Shelby Manor advised that Comcast, WOW, and AT&T are available to the residents. Mr. Flynn explained when you sign a lease agreement with Comcast, only its brochure will be available. The other brochures will not be available. The residents can still order cable from the other two companies, but we are only going to provide marketing support in exchange for \$6,600. Under this agreement, additional revenue will be provided to the Township through a marketing arrangement.

Mr. Flynn agreed to do research on this marketing plan with input to be provided later to the Board. The information submitted this evening will also be reviewed and this item will be placed on a future agenda for further discussion.

Mrs. Kowal said we have to remember most seniors don't subscribe to cable and those that do subscribe to basic service.

Mrs. Darga informed the Board since Comcast went digital, the cameras in the lobbies have not worked in about six months. The residents can't see who is visiting. Comcast said until we sign the contract, the equipment will not be upgraded. The residents have been concerned about the cameras not working.

Mrs. Filar asked for Mrs. Darga's feeling about signing a contract and only offering marketing materials for Comcast. Mrs. Darga said she typically gives out the phone numbers for Comcast and WOW. She can give out strictly Comcast numbers and has no problem with that. Her main concern is to get the cameras running as soon as possible.

Mrs. Filar has a problem with them saying I'm not going to fix your cameras unless you sign the agreement.

Mrs. Kowal said they don't get paid for those cameras. Mrs. Darga said they can't fix the cameras because they no longer offer analogue – everything went digital and our system is outdated.

Mr. Stathakis would also like to have a conversation with John Martin prior to a decision being made.

Mrs. Kowal advised this will be placed on the agenda for the second meeting in August. She was asked to provide a recommendation from Mr. Lehto, the attorney who handles the Township's cable matters.

Mr. Wozniak asked if we don't sign the agreement with Comcast, can we get the cameras fixed. Mrs. Darga responded there would be a significant cost of approximately \$20,000 for a new digital camera system.

Mrs. Kowal said Comcast has no reason to provide this service at no charge.

Discussion followed.

Mr. Viar arrived.

Mr. Stathakis said he will request a written recommendation from Mr. Lehto and have it e-mailed to the Board members.

2. Discussion regarding Shelby Manor with Township Engineer Fazal Khan and Associates

A presentation was made by Dr. Hutchins of DiHydro Services, Inc. regarding the fire suppression system at Shelby Manor. Input was provided on the work performed and the testing that was completed. According to past records, the Township has never performed its ten-year inspections. The work recently performed was to insure the system was operating efficiently. Fire Marshal Dean Kueppers agreed with the information provided.

Mr. Stathakis understands there was a fire at one of the buildings and was concerned when he learned the sprinklers in a particular section of the building were not working properly. He was told the work had been done in a timely manner and everything is now working efficiently. Mr. Stathakis was relieved that we only had water damage and not a burnt out building.

Discussion followed among the members.

Fire Chief Gene Shepherd clarified that it wasn't that the building hadn't been inspected. It is always inspected. It is up to the management company to call for an inspection on the sprinkler system. This is not a function of the Fire Department. You must be a certified sprinkler company to perform that inspection.

Discussion followed.

It was agreed that we maintain continuity with one company to insure the system is maintained and inspected properly. With the prior management company, a log was not completed when inspections were made. There was no record of what work was actually done.

Mr. Wood, Building Director, offered precautionary measures that can be taken to insure the system is working properly.

Mr. Flynn provided his input and suggestions.

Mr. Stathakis believes this would be an automatic safeguard to prevent serious problems in the future. He is comfortable with Fazal Khan and Dean Kueppers working together.

Laurie Hepburn, Property Manager of Shelby Manor, advised inspections had been done; however, they were not sufficient enough to find the recent problem that had occurred.

Painting of the exterior of the building was discussed. This had been approved last year but not completed because of the weather. It was agreed the color would be a shade of blue. The quote received was from Classic Painting of St. Clair Shores for \$42,750.

Replacing the roof on each of the units was addressed. Mr. Stathakis asked Mr. Khan to solicit bids – one for each building and the other for all three buildings. A decision can be made at that time. It will probably be included in next year's budget. Mrs. Kowal said the RFP should state the prices will be good for at least six months.

Repairing the asphalt in the parking lot was discussed with a cost of approximately \$11,000.

MOTION by Filar, supported by Wozniak, to adjourn. Motion carried.

The work session adjourned at 6:37 p.m.

Special Land Use Approval for Fritz Enterprises (Recycling Operation Modification) for property located at 4735 22 Mile Road (north of 22 Mile Road between Ryan Road and Shelby Road)

This site has been used by a construction company for a number of years. Last year the township approved plans to expand the scope of the business to include the recycling of ferrous and nonferrous metals. Site improvements to accommodate this business were largely limited to the addition of three roll off storage containers located on the site.

The site has been recently acquired by a new company that proposes expansion of the recycling operation. In addition to accepting ferrous and nonferrous materials, this site will also recycle automobiles. Site improvements that will be added to accommodate this expanded business include new fencing, lighting, and an above ground fuel storage tank.

The site encompasses 3.3 acres of land and lacks frontage on a public road. Access is provided by an easement across abutting property to 22 Mile Road. The property includes two buildings with the remainder of the site used for outdoor storage. The abutting property to the south and west is similarly used for industrial purposes and outdoor storage.

This site is zoned HM, Heavy Manufacturing. Recycling facilities are not specifically listed as either a permitted or special land use in this zoning district. The list of special land uses allowed in the HM district includes two uses that have characteristics that may be similar to a recycling facility. These include junk yards (Section 13.30) and refuse disposal incinerators and transfer stations (Section 13.44). The zoning ordinance also gives the Planning Commission the opportunity to consider other special land uses that have similar characteristics. This proposed use appears to be similar to the other uses allowed in the HM district with special land use approval.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on this proposed special land use on Wednesday, July 11, 2011 and recommended approval of this application.

In response to your phone request to Bill Mosher regarding our submittal for approval of modifications to the site plan previously approved by the Township, please be advised as follows. Fritz Enterprises, Inc. leased the above referenced parcel from DeBuck Properties, LLC for the purpose of operating a recycling center at the site. The Lease commenced May 1, 2011. We are preparing the site for that activity. Below is a summary of the requested changes to the earlier site plan approved by the Township.

- 1. The materials submitted by Ray DeBuck in connection with his site plan approval listed examples of non-ferrous metals to be received and recycled at the site. The Site Plan document incorrectly noted that non-ferrous metals were not to be received.
- 2. The description of ferrous materials to be received has been expanded to include automobiles with the noted limitation that automobiles may only be re received at the site for transportation to other facilities of the Applicant for processing.

PURPOSE OF THE PUBLIC HEARING: TO ACT ON SITE PLAN #11-09 (SLU-6) FRITZ ENTERPRISES (RECYCLING OPERATION MODIFICATION); 4735 22 MILE ROAD, LOCATED NORTH OF 22 MILE ROAD BETWEEN SHELBY ROAD AND RYAN ROAD

Secretary Breen read the notice of public hearing as published in The Source Newspaper the week of June 26, 2011.

Chairman Moffitt stated that nine property owners and three applicants were notified of this meeting by First Class Mail on June 24, 2011.

Attorney Deneweth indicated that the publication meets the legal requirements of the State statute and local ordinances.

Attorney Deneweth stated that the present zoning is HM (Heavy Manufacturing) and under the special land use ordinances this is a permitted request.

Wynn stated that this site has been used by a construction company for a number of years. Last year the township approved plans to expand the scope of the business to include the recycling of ferrous and nonferrous metals. Site improvements to accommodate this business were largely limited to the addition of three roll off storage containers located on the site.

The site has been recently acquired by a new company that proposes expansion of the recycling operation. In addition to accepting ferrous and nonferrous materials, this site will also recycle automobiles. Site improvements that will be added to accommodate this expanded business include new fencing, lighting and an above ground fuel storage tank.

Chairman Moffitt explained the format for the Public Hearing.

Bill Mosher, 279 N. Glenngarry, Bloomfield Township is representing Fritz Enterprises. Mr. Mosher explained the ownership of the property. In addition to the previous site plan ferrous materials will include automobiles with the noted limitation that automobiles may only be received at the site for storage and then transported to other facilities for processing. The automobiles will only be stored at this location. Fencing for the entire site will be added. Installation of an above ground diesel storage tank will be added.

Bill Elson, Senior Vice-President of Fritz Enterprises Inc., 1650 W. Jefferson, Trenton, Michigan, discussed the recycling business and the location of other facilities. Mr. Elson stated that the automobiles will not be processed at this location. They will be taken to other facilities. He stated they will employee eight to ten people.

Moffitt asked how many automobiles would be stored at this location. Mr. Elson stated not more than thirty-six at a time. Moffitt asked how long the vehicles would be at this location before being transferred to a processing facility. Mr. Elson stated that the vehicles would not be stored for any length of time.

Moffitt asked if this facility had all the permits required by the Health Department and Department of Environmental Quality. Mr. Elson stated that they hold all permits required for this facility.

Chairman Moffitt explained the format.

Chairman Moffitt opened the meeting to the public.

No one spoke for or against this application.

Wynn stated his comments as follows:

- Screening consisting of a 50 foot wide greenbelt is required whenever an industrial use abuts a residential zoning district. Section 5.01.2 of the zoning ordinance gives the Planning Commission the authority to reduce or modify these screening requirements provided that equivalent screening is provided by existing wooded areas on the site, topographic or other natural conditions. The closest single family home is located approximately 750 feet to the north of this site and is separated by a heavily wooded area. These trees provide effective natural screening. Additional screening on this site is therefore not necessary at this time.
- Add a property address to the site plan.
- The above ground storage fuel storage tank is required to observe a setback of 100 feet top to the northerly property line which is zoned R-1-C, One Family Residential. The design and specifications of the enclosure must comply with all applicable Fire Department requirements.
- The existing surface of the site consists of a combination of asphalt, gravel and dirt. Some improvements to the unpaved surface may be necessary to accommodate this operation. The zoning ordinance was recently amended to give the Planning Commission the authority to approve the use of a non-paved gravel surface for outdoor storage yards. The minimum specification for this type of surface is 21AA gravel unless another material is determined to be acceptable by the township engineer.
- Lighting details are required (pole height, fixture design and lighting intensity).
- The automotive recycling component of this operation should be explained. Will the site only be used for storage or will some processing of vehicles also take place on this site?
- Provide handicapped parking spaces with signage. Macomb county Health Department approval is required. A certificate of zoning compliance and associated inspections are required for the building. (Building Department)
- No additional municipal utilities are required for the proposed use. (DPW)

The engineer comments are as follows:

- A professional's (Architect, Landscape Architect, Planner, PS or PE) seal and signature must be on the plans.
- The legal description for the overall site has a minor error, and the legal description for the second ingress-egress easement is missing two calls.
- The proposed fence is not indicated, along with the proposed fence material. The letter indicates that perimeter fencing will be provided according to the site plan.
- A detail for the proposed pole lights (2) should be added to the plan.
- The water service to the building, or existing well location should be shown.
- The reserve septic area must be shown.
- The adequacy of the proposed detention/retention area can be determined during engineering review.
- The ingress/egress road is outside of the recorded easement.

Moffitt asked that if the property to north is developed will the screening be sufficient. Wynn stated that in the motion we could say "We accept the screening as being adequate. In the event that there is future development to the north the screening will be reevaluated".

Motion by Breen, supported by Randlett, to close the public hearing. Motion carried.

Chairman Moffitt stated that the Planning Commission's decision must be based on the following standards:

- 1. Compatibility with adjacent land uses.
- 2. Consistent with and promote the intent and purpose of the special land use.
- 3. Compatibility with the natural environment

4. Consistent with the capacities of public services and facilities affected by the proposed use.

- 5. Protect the public health, safety, and welfare.
- 6. The adequacy of public access to this site.

The Planning Commission may approve, disapprove, or table the same to evaluate the information received this evening.

Motion by Moore, supported by Breen, to recommend approval of special land use application #11-09 (SLU-6) Fritz Enterprises (Recycling Operation Modification); 4735 22 Mile Road, located North of 22 Mile Road between Shelby Road and Ryan Road to permit the use of this site for a metal recycling business based on the following findings:

- 1. The use of the site is consistent with the surrounding land use pattern which is predominantly industrial in nature including considerable outdoor storage.
- 2. There are no immediately abutting residential uses that would be adversely impacted by this business.
- 3. Adequate access is provided to the site from an existing easement and paved driveway to 22 Mile Road. Maintenance of easement will be required.
- 4. The hours of operation are from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
- 5. The use must comply with all applicable federal, state and local regulations for recycling businesses.
- 6. A revised site plan must be provided addressing the comments of the planning director, township engineer and building director.
- 7. No processing or disassembling of automobiles on the site.
- 8. We accept the screening as being adequate. In the event that there is future development to the north the screening will be reevaluated.

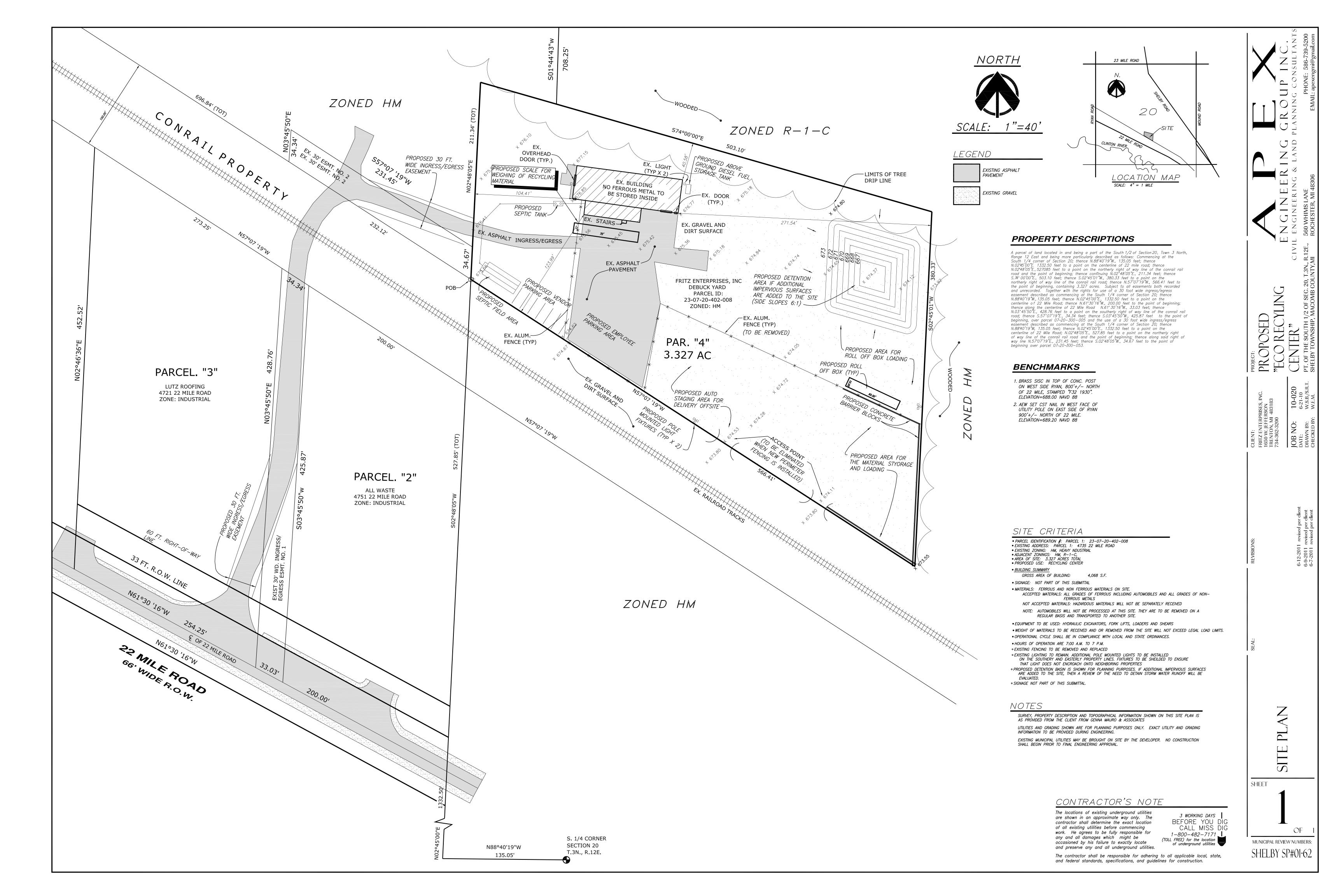

Re: Request to establish Eligibility Lists, Account Processors

The Human Resources Director respectfully requests Board of Trustees approval to establish eligibility lists for the positions of Account Processor I (UAW General Grade 12), Account Processor II (UAW General Grade 14) and Account Processor III (UAW General Grade 19). These eligibility lists, once established, will be used to fill vacancies when an employee in an account processor classification retires and only at the approval of the Board.

The Township currently employees eight (8) people in the positions of Account Processor I, II, III & IV. Four of the eight employees are eligible to retire in the next two years. These positions are in the Township's Department of Public Works, Treasurer's office and Financial Management Department. Proposed minutes for the meeting held on Monday, June 20, 2011 At the Shelby Township Parks, Recreation and Maintenance Department 52700 Van Dyke Avenue, Shelby Township, Michigan

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Mr. Zilli (in Mr. Thomas' absence) at 7:00 pm.

Members Present: Stacy Cerget, Michael Flynn, Don Watchowski, Joe Youngblood, Brian Zilli

Members Absent: Jo Ann Burgess, Blaise Klenow, Michael Thomas

Approval of the Agenda: A MOTION to accept the agenda as submitted was made by Mr. Flynn, and supported by Mrs. Cerget. Motion carried.

Approval of the Minutes: A MOTION was made by Mrs. Cerget to accept the proposed minutes from the regular meeting of June 20, 2011 as written. Supported by Mr. Flynn. Motion carried.

ITC Tree Removal: Mr. Youngblood briefed the group regarding the trail that will be affected, the fact that it will be clear-cut, and when the process is scheduled to begin. He spoke about his attendance at a recent Macomb Orchard Trail meeting and gave a synopsis of what was discussed.

Mr. Youngblood stated that he feels the clear-cutting will be devastating to the wildlife along the trail. He believes that Macomb County will receive a number of complaints, and at this point there is nothing that Shelby Township can do about it. The decision was made at the county level.

Mr. Zilli asked what the \$500,000 that ITC paid will go for. Mr. Youngblood replied that it is supposed to fund the re-landscaping with approved plantings.

Additional discussion involved how the clear-cutting will most likely happen, who it will affect, and the anticipated approximate timeframe for the project.

UCS Sports for Grades 7 & 8: Mr. Youngblood said that it is his understanding that Utica Community Schools will offer football in the fall for grades 7 & 8 and no other sports after that. He noted that he spoke to UCS Athletic Director Rob Dilday who told him that they are working on getting funding for a parent run "club sports" type program. Discussion followed. Mr. Youngblood stated he would be keeping in touch with Mr. Dilday and will report any new information to the Committee.

Mrs. Cerget asked Mr. Youngblood if he had a plan to offer a program if the schools did not. Mr. Youngblood replied that he did and gave a brief explanation.

RC Racetrack Proposal: Mr. Youngblood distributed copies of a proposal that was submitted to him. He gave a brief explanation and asked the group to look it over. This proposal did not provide any type of funding so Mr. Youngblood advised that he plans to tell the submitter there is no money available to fund such a project. He added that Shelby Township already has a RC track that almost never gets used, so he will offer them use of it.

Dog Park Update: Mr. Youngblood reported that he contacted some other communities about their use of swipe cards for dog park entry, dog registration revenues, dog park issues, etc. He noted that he does not feel this is a good time to put out any township monies for such a project, but would welcome a group or organization to raise and donate funds to get it started.

Onyx Property Update: Mr. Youngblood reported that the Shelby Township Beautification Committee would like to utilize a small area for a garden and he would like to include a natural trail made of slag to go around the outer border of the parcel. A short discussion followed.

Committee Membership: Mr. Youngblood stated that Steve Nadolski is still interested in a seat on the Committee. However, he is very involved in Little League and the meetings conflict with his game schedule so he has not been available to attend.

Ms. McLaughlin noted for the committee that the mileage reimbursement rate has increased to \$.555 per mile, and whoever will be driving next week to view the nominated gardens should use this rate.

Mr. Hearon asked that the Clerk's Office process the following invoices and reimbursements:

John Baas in the amount of \$81.00 for the June 16, 2011 BCSEM meeting registration for six members, and \$36.21 for round-trip mileage of 71 miles to and from Farmington Hills.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. Hearon discussed the Treasurer's Report which he emailed to the members previously. He noted that Mr. Baas suggested that the remaining Clean Up Day funds in the amount of \$904.24 be reallocated to the Miscellaneous fund.

MOTION by Carol McLaughlin, supported by Erika Zoller that we reallocate to the Miscellaneous Fund the remaining Clean Up Day monies in the amount of \$904.24.

Motion carried.

SCHOENHERR MAINTENANCE

Ms. Roelandt reported that she had spoken previously with Sam Marino about planting the replacement tree in the fall. Discussion followed about the July 5, 2011 letter from Sam Marino, in which he indicated the price of the lawn maintenance will be raised from the contract price of \$38 per cut to \$120 per cut. It was noted that he bid this job, and entered into a three-year contract with the township, with covered years 2010, 2011 and 2012. There was also a question about the mulching portion of the contract he has with the township for Schoenherr.

Mr. Hearon discussed an individual he works with at K-Mart who mows lawns, and it is possible that we could approach him with an offer. Discussion followed about liability insurance.

Ms. Roelandt advised that when we bid out this contract in early 2010, we received bids from Universal Lawn Care at \$60 per cut, and United Lawnscape at \$84 per cut. She noted that we were happy with United Lawnscape when they previously maintained the boulevard.

Lengthy discussion followed about the next steps to take. It was agreed to move forward with a recommendation to give to the Board in order to continue the maintenance of Schoenherr Boulevard.

MOTION by Melanee Roelandt, supported by Erika Zoller, to recommend to the Board of Trustees that if the contract with Marino's Lawn & Landscape for the lawn cutting and mulching of Schoenherr Boulevard is terminated, that the committee contact United Lawnscape to ask if their bid in the amount of \$84 per cut submitted last year could be honored for the rest of this season and next year.

Ms. Roelandt noted that United Lawnscape's bid did not include weeding in the \$84 price for cutting, and that would be charged separately at a rate of \$56 biweekly. Ms. Roelandt said she is comfortable going with United Lawnscape, and ask if they could weed once per month at \$56.

Ms. Zoller said she is comfortable leaving out the weeding work at this time and all agreed. The members also agreed they are not comfortable continuing to work with Marino any longer due to the way he handled this issue.

After listening to the voicemail message Sam Marino left with Ms. Roelandt, all agreed that it sounded as though he was no longer able to do the work, and that the township could likely contract with another company to do the work at the same price.

Motion carried.

Mr. Hearon asked if we could hold off on the planting of a replacement tree from accident 1, and also combine it with the planting of the replacement trees damaged in accident 2. Discussion followed about the types of trees suitable for the boulevard areas.

Ms. McLaughlin asked how many trees need to be replaced, and Mr. Hearon stated there are five trees currently which were damaged in accidents. There are two to three more if we replace those trees which are not doing well there. Some discussion followed about the appearance of the boulevard if trees were not replaced. Ms. Roelandt reminded everyone that we did receive \$600 from the insurance company of the driver responsible for damaging the tree in the first accident, and the funds are in the Beautification Committee account waiting to be dispersed.

Ms. Roelandt felt that we should ask for more prices to replace the trees. It was suggested that Thoms Brothers might be interested in quoting the replacement trees.

WELCOME TO SHELBY SIGNS

Mr. Hearon reported that he contacted Steve Thoms about the landscaping at the Schoenherr sign area.

SCHOENHERR MAINTENANCE, (return to discussion)

Ms. Roelandt reminded everyone that the township has signed a contract with Marino for the replacement of the first tree damaged.

Mr. Hearon offered to contact Mr. Thoms to give us a quote to replace all of the eight trees, quoting the first tree damaged separately, pending the outcome of the Marino contract decision. Ms. Roelandt offered to meet with Mr. Thoms at the site.

Ms. Zoller asked about our tendency to overplant, and should we ask Mr. Thoms if we really need to replace all seven. All agreed to ask his opinion on that issue.

WELCOME TO SHELBY SIGNS, (return to discussion)

To continue this discussion before Ms. Roelandt has to leave the meeting, Mr. Hearon stated that the plantings will take place in the fall. Mr. Thoms said it would make sense for the sign enhancements to be done before planting. He proposes to use the existing sign and erect new pillars on each side.

Ms. Roelandt weighed in on the enhancements and stated that she likes the proposal, but suggested a new resin sign. Ms. Zoller said she also likes the design, but thinks that enhancing the current sign is not wise. Mr. Stafford thought the current sign is not rotting but should be re-painted. Mr. Hearon believes the existing sign is in good enough condition. Discussion followed about

the proposal. Ms. Zoller wondered if when the time comes to replace the current wood sign, could we replace it with a more durable resin sign, using the pillars being discussed tonight. Mr. Stafford explained that he believes that the current sign would be attached somehow to the pillars, and so then could be easily replaced.

The question tonight is whether to renovate the existing sign by adding the pillars. Mr. Stafford asked when the last time the sign was painted, and it was thought it was at least five years ago. Mr. Thoms stated in his May 19th email to Mr. Hearon that he felt if new pillars were installed and the signs painted, the life of the existing sign could be extended for another 10 or more years. Mr. Thoms did not give a price for repainting in his quote.

Mr. Hearon said the quote consists of two pillars (Stonemakers) with caps for \$875, the foot wall (underneath sign) for \$400, for a total cost of \$1,275. Mr. Hearon stated he believes the steel edging referred to in the proposal is the edging around the plant material, and would be an additional \$300.

The second option (Brussels) was a total of \$1,675 for the pillars, caps and foot wall, with an additional \$300 for the steel edging.

Ms. Zoller feels that this is a project on which we should not scrimp. We should make this sign substantial. She thinks we should use stone. Ms. Kent wondered if we are settling.

Mr. Hearon would like the members to think about this project and discuss again next month. He would like a final decision in August so that the planting can be done in the fall. Mr. Hearon will also invite Steve Thoms to attend next month's meeting.

CLEAN UP DAY/ADOPT A ROAD SIGNS

Ms. McLaughlin reported that the Macomb County Department of Roads has installed new Adopt-a-Road signs from this year's applicants. In addition, she has a new family who is adopting 24 Mile Road between Dequindre to Shelby.

Mr. Hearon also noted that Mark Hackel recently encouraged citizens to get involved in cleaning up roadsides in the county.

HANGING BASKETS

Comments were received from the members on the beautiful hanging baskets on the Municipal Grounds. All agreed that this year's choice of flowers is very good.

MOUND ROAD IMPROVEMENTS AND MAINTENANCE

Mr. Hearon stated this item will be discussed in the future. Mr. Hearon noted that PRM is not planting the trees at this location until the weather is better for planting. The trees were a received as a result of a grant from DTE.

MEMORIAL FOR GEORGE PAYNE

Mr. Hearon asked if the consensus was for a tree to be planted at the Nature Center. Ms. McLaughlin explained that the form is available on the township's website. The price of the tree includes a weatherproof, engraved plaque with a message of the committee's choosing, and an acknowledgement is sent to the honoree's family. The price is \$250. Ms. McLaughlin volunteered to coordinate this project. She would like to get input from the committee for the wording on the plaque. Discussion followed. This is a purchase funded by the committee members, and not township funds. We will plan a fall planting and invite Mrs. Payne to attend.

2011 BEAUTIFICATION AWARDS

Ms. Zoller reported that we are going to view a total of 11 gardens on both Monday, July 18 and Tuesday, July 19. Ms. Makinen offered to drive her van. Mr. Stafford will determine the route to be taken, and will also bring his camera to take the photos. Discussion followed as to who will be able to view the gardens this year, the certificates and photographs for Jan Long.

Lengthy discussion followed about the awards given to the Hall of Fame winners. All agreed on the Pennsylvania Bluestone at Pottery Land, but the size of the stone needs to be decided. Ms. Zoller asked to consider whether or not to continue to give the engraved plaque to the Hall of Fame winners in addition to the stone. It was suggested that the winners receive the engraved plaque the first two years, with only the stone in the third year. This will be decided at next month's meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by Chairman Matt Stachowicz.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION by Viar, supported by Semaan, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Charter Township of Shelby Fire & Police Pension and Retirement Board held on Monday, June 20, 2011, as submitted, and waive the reading Motion carried.

PRESENTATIONS

Nickel & Saph

Mr. Semaan indicated that he received an e-mail from Nickel & Saph stating that they are preparing additional quotes for the Township. They want to postpone their presentation until August 15. Mr. Semaan feels we may receive a better rate if various policies are lumped together.

Merrill Lynch - The Brice Group

Mr. Brice reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the month ending June 30, 2011. The beginning market value was \$55,241,490. Contributions for the month totaled \$1,557,151. Interest and dividends were \$130,883. Losses for the month totaled \$801,594 with an ending market value of \$56,127,930.

The lower portion of the report reflects a pension payment of \$352,481.69 posted on June 1, 2011.

Mr. Brice distributed a handout reflecting the market value as of July 15, 2011. Under the "market value" column in the middle of the report, the total is \$55,777,664. Under the "actual" column, large cap equity is reflected at 39.2% with a target by policy of 38.0%; small/mid cap equity — 12.0% with a target of 10.0%; international equity — 10.8% with a target of 12.0%; and real estate 5.7% with a target of 5.0%. This brings the sub-total of equities to 67.6% with a target of 65.0%. Fixed income is reflected at 31.1% with a target of 35.0% and cash at 1.3% with a target of 0%. In total, fixed income/cash is reflected at 32.4% with a target of 35.0%.

Mr. Brice explained that the lower portion of the report reflects allocations by investment managers. It shows the total market value with a breakdown provided by cash, equity and fixed income.

Mr. Diegel questioned why Earnest Partners is so high in cash. Mr. Brice responded that on any given day the rates fluctuate. They are typically below 5%.

Eaton Vance

Mr. James Queen and Mr. Matthew Navins of Eaton Vance were in attendance. A presentation was made focusing on the performance of the Pension Board's portfolio and the strategy followed by their company.

The performance of Eaton Vance trailed the benchmark in recent times; however, the good news is that they feel they are coming to a point in time where the relative performance is set to improve which is shown in the most recent quarter's performance. A continued improvement is also reflected in the month of July.

Eaton Vance's strategy for investment is to look for companies that they consider to be very strong business franchises and are either the market leader in their industry or have a dominant brand in place, i.e. McDonald's, Microsoft, IBM, etc. The goal of their strategy is to provide above average performance relative to their peers and their benchmark in the context of less risk. Over the long-term, they believe this strategy works.

They realize that they have had a difficult time over the last couple of years delivering an above-average performance which they believe has a lot to do with the market.

Mr. Diegel brought up that on Page 19 of the submittal, the 10-year net number is just over 3% compared to a benchmark of 4 ½%. Mr. Brice feels we are in the ballpark. He doesn't feel this chart is relevant. He provided an explanation.

Mr. Navins explained a section in the handout comparing the market cap percentage of the portfolio vs. the Russell 1000 Value Index as of 3/31/2011. The list provided was broken down by the size of the company. A large portion of the Pension Board's portfolio is invested in very large cap companies with a value of \$50 billion and greater.

A performance by S&P Equity Quality Rankings was presented for the period March 31, 2009 through March 31, 2011.

Mr. Navins said they have been through a very tough stretch of performance and they are very much aware of it. The good news is that the people who are running the portfolio today are the same people who were responsible for the track record for the last 10 years. They haven't changed their strategy or chased performance. They stayed with what they know and if history is any sort of guide these small cap rallies always transition in some point. He feels we are at that transition point. If you look at the month of July, Eaton Vance has already made up somewhere in the neighborhood of 50 basis points. Over the past 3 or 4 months they have almost come back 150 basis points or 11.5% of the performance that they lost. They don't look for companies with high dividend yields but they look for companies that are growing or initiating new dividends.

Mr. Diegel referred to page 14 and asked if Eaton Vance's market cap had consistently been that high compared to the benchmark. Mr. Navins said this is higher than it has been. They have always been at least in line with or a little bit bigger because they typically don't buy those small cap companies. They have never owned companies that are less than \$5 billion in market cap.

Mr. Diegel asked if all of this improvement in Eaton Vance's returns over the last three or four months is related to anything other than the fact that they are sticking to their guns and their style is getting back into favor. Mr. Navins said that is exactly it. They haven't changed anything within the portfolio that has altered their profile. It has purely been the market changing preferences.

Mr. Diegel asked Mr. Navins if they are gaining or losing clients at this point. He responded they had about \$34 million in assets. Today their assets are a little more than \$30 million. This is a combination of the market moving down and clients reallocating assets. They haven't been losing clients outright. They have a few more redemptions in the mutual fund side recently than they had

historically. In the last six months, they have actually gained clients. Along the institutional side, they had a number of big institutions move money toward them. Generally speaking, it has been stable.

Mr. Brice asked with regard to the under-performance for the last couple of years, how much can be attributed to poor stock selection. Mr. Navins responded that many of the types of companies that they like or invest in have For example, in 2010 they had holdings that were tied been poor performers. to the Gulf of Mexico. They fit all of their criteria and were top-notch companies in their space. Unfortunately, you would have to be a genius to predict that event. No amount of fundamental research would make us aware of this. three stocks were sold during April and May of last year. Those stocks all snapped back. They lost money on the way down and lost some opportunity on Among those three stocks, Eaton Vance lost about 180 basis the way up. points of performance. He also relayed problems they had with Hewlett Packard.

Questions of Mr. Brice were addressed by Mr. Navins.

Representatives from Eaton Vance left the meeting.

Treasurer's Report (continued)

Mr. Brice briefly reviewed the U.S. Performance Monitor dated July 1, 2011.

"B+ or Better" ranked stocks outperformed "B or Worse" ranked stocks in the year to date by 3.3 percentage points. In the second quarter, "B+ or better stocks" outperformed by 2.5 percentage points.

Mr. Brice explained how this relates to Eaton Vance.

In the second quarter, defensive sectors led – Health Care and Utilities were the top performers, and Telecom and Staples also saw positive returns for the quarter. Cyclical sectors generally lost ground. This is a departure from first quarter leadership, where cyclical sectors like Energy and Industrials led, and defensive sectors underperformed. Financials was the worst performer in June, in the second quarter, and for the first half of the year.

Mr. Brice stated at the last meeting we discussed the "watch letter" that Eaton Vance received and the period of time they would be monitored closely relative to that status which is not to exceed more than two quarters. Knowing what the environment is doing, this is strategy that should outperform.

Mr. Diegel asked for an explanation of Mr. Brice's statement about Eaton Vance being monitored for two quarters.

Mr. Brice responded by saying the letter

submitted to Eaton Vance indicated they would be on notice and monitored for the next two quarters relative to the benchmark and peers in the proper contents.

They agreed and stated if the first six months of this year repeats itself in the next six months and we are underperforming that is a problem for them.

Mr. Diegel asked if this relates to the June and September quarter. Mr. Brice replied they just outperformed in the June quarter. From his standpoint, he wouldn't take them off watch if they performed well in the third quarter. He would wait until the end of the year.

Mr. Brice addressed the Investment Policy as it relates to this type of situation. The Pension Board's policy doesn't clearly define the timeframe. It doesn't say it has to be a month, one quarter, or two quarters. You don't want to write a policy that is so tight that it can be easily violated. Mr. Semaan added that when we wrote the policy, we didn't want to be painted into a corner. If a company was our investment manager and we knew they were a quality company, we didn't want to have to let them go just because they had two bad quarters. There are some people in the industry who would suggest writing into the policy that if it deviates at all, stick to the time period and there is no decision making process here at the Board. The Brice Group can assist the Pension Board in this type of language if they wish to revise their policy and run on auto pilot. However, it is currently drafted without a timeframe and that is why the letter will provide more definition by time.

Mr. Brice explained the handout provided showing Eaton Vance's performance from its inception in 2007 through June 30, 2011.

Similar information was provided for Alliance Bernstein which is also on watch.

Mr. Brice advised their quarterly report will be available at the August meeting for review.

Since Nickel and Saph will be making a presentation in August and Mr. Brice will present their quarterly report, Marsico and Earnest Partners will not be invited until the September meeting.

MOTION by Semaan, supported by Viar, to accept the financial reports, as presented.

Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

The investment policy will be discussed further when Mr. Moffitt is in attendance.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Diegel asked that he be registered for the MAPERS Conference to be held in September. Mr. Semaan replied that he would be included.
